# **Second Sunday of Easter**

# Dear Parishioners,

In the Gospel of John this week, Jesus said, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I send you." Jesus was asking each of us to venture out and spread the good news in the same way he was sent by the Father to spread his message. The question can then be posed, "In the world today, how are we being sent out to spread the peace of God?"

Three months ago, my son and I traveled to Mississippi with Sister Sheral to aid families who had lost their homes to Hurricane Katrina. My first impression of the area was shock at the devastation still around after two years. There were blocks with only foundations where houses once stood. However, in the midst of devastation, I witnessed people who were spreading the peace of God.

When we first arrived at Saint Ann's Parish in Lizana, there were over one hundred volunteers who had traveled from all over the United States to help families they had never met. I felt the same amazement the next day as we waited in a library that had been turned into an operation center for volunteers. Some of the volunteers were residing with us in Lizana but many were housed in other local areas. As I looked around the room, I realized the average age was between fifteen and twenty. Many of the adults were the chaperones for trips of younger students in high school and college who willingly spent their Christmas vacation helping families they did not even know. The experience was eloquently stated by the mayor of Pass Christian at a Saturday night dinner for the volunteers. Hurricane Katrina brought destruction to the city of Pass Christian, but it additionally brought a sense of hope for the future of our country in the number of young volunteers who have traveled to Pass Christian in order to help the community rebuild. These young adults are living testaments that the message of Jesus is still alive today. It causes us to reflect on where Jesus is sending each of us.


