can't recall a time when the Catholic religion wasn't a part of my life. I was born into a large family that was devote Catholic. My mother, Aurora Estelita and my father, Alec Estelita purchased the family home in Mills Park in 1947. I am the baby of 8 brothers and sisters and we


all attended St. Robert's School. My oldest brother, Tom was one of the first graduating classes St. Bruno's School, now known as St. Robert's School. Along with our education, my mother was an active parishioner and our guiding force in our Catholic faith. She instilled in us the beliefs and values of what the Catholic religion represents. My mother was an active member of the St. Robert's Women's Guild and did a lot of work behind the scenes. My father was also a member of the Men's Club for St. Robert's. It was common then to have big families and we were blessed to be surrounded by such wonderful families like the Kelly's, the Monaghan's, the Sweeney's and the Cilia's to name a few.

Sunday was an event in our home. As a child, I remember getting ready for church and the chaos of it all. As you can imagine, 10 people trying to look their Sunday best with one bathroom usually resulted in an unholy ordeal. I don't know how my parents did it but we were always at Sunday Mass, thankful for having each other and Church (and praying for an extra bathroom). After Mass, our family used to take a Sunday ride and enjoy exploring new places together. St. Robert's is connected to the finest memories of my childhood in that I had my family, my friend, my education and my faith.

Before I became a father, I thought long and hard about how I wanted to raise my children. It occurred to me that my childhood gave me a wonderful foundation for the kind of experiences I wanted my own children to have. St. Robert's would be a vital part in my own family.

When I met my wife, Trish, I recognized the same wonderful qualities that my mother had towards the Catholic faith and I knew she was the one for me. Trish and I have 4 beautiful daughters: Amanda, Megan, Emily and Natalie. Without realizing the importance of their names, my wife and I recognized that our daughters initials spell AMEN. It was a sign. They were all baptized at St. Roberts and are active parishioners today. My daughter, Megan was recently in the Passion Play at St. Robert's Church and had a very important role-Jesus. How ironic since her birthday is December 25!

Living the Liturgy

A People of God's Own

The readings we hear this weekend are apt for today. The reading from Acts tells of the controversy which initiated the diaconate. A group of widowed "parishioners" of a different language and culture feel neglected, so the people in leadership - the apostles - call the community together and make a proposal. We can't do everything, they say, so you choose seven men from your community who are "filled with the Spirit and wisdom" to take care of the widows' needs. The need is recognized; the community is involved in the solution; and those who are chosen are officially commissioned. In many parishes, we see the same respectful pattern as communities try to respond to the needs of new immigrants, the newly divorced and single parents, recovering alcoholics and other people with specific needs. May the Spirit continue to guide the Church to respond to the needs of her diverse members!

The second reading reminds us of our dignity as "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of [God's] own." When the Pope is here this week, he may invite us to remember that great call of ours, leading not to a sense of superiority, but to deep gratitude which impels us to share with others God's goodness. In the gospel, Jesus reveals the Father to his followers and to us. As the Father works through Jesus, he will also work through us once the Spirit comes to guide and strengthen us.

This Tuesday is Earth Day, once only noted by hard-core environmentalists and "tree-huggers," but now recognized as a moral issue for all of us. Our US Catholic Bishops have initiated a new website at

www.catholicsandclimatechange.org to "contribute a distinctive and authentic Catholic voice to the public debate highlighting the human and moral dimensions of this issue and encouraging the Catholic community to involved in practical and public policy remedies become to address climate change." The Bishops testified to the U.S. Senate last June that "those who contribute least to climate change will be affected the most and have the least capacity to cope or escape. The poor and vulnerable are most likely to pay the price of inaction or unwise actions. We all have an obligation to help make sure their voices are heard, their needs addressed, and their burdens eased as our nation and the world address climate change." The unintended consequence of our making ethanol from corn has almost doubled the price of corn for poor people throughout the world, causing Haitians and other very low-income people to be on the brink of starvation. It takes 32 lbs. of grain to produce one pound of beef. It's good to eat lower on the food chain: pork and chicken take much less grain to produce. Francis Moore Lappè has said that if every country aspired to the American standard of living, it would take five planets to support us! So, let's try this week to be aware of our decisions and how they affect the worldwide human community. Peace, S. Sheral


