The war was over, thank God! My beautiful fiancé, June Kelly and I were married in St. Philips Church in San Francisco December 1, 1945.

In 1947 we moved to San Bruno where we purchase a brand new 2 bedroom home for \$10,000-wow! That's the year Archbishop Mitty gave St. Bruno's Parish permission to build a school contingent upon our ability to raise sufficient funds. Needless to say, the pledge committee got organized and raised the money in nothing flat. We had St. Bruno's School and the classes began the school year of 1949. What a glorious day-a convent full of Nuns, working groups like the Women's club, Men's Club, choir, ushers, bingo and later Lectors and Eucharistic Ministers.

We had our fun too—dinners, dances variety shows, festivals and later Grownups and Inbetweeners.

In 1958 the beautiful church was built, and dedicated as St. Roberts Church and Parish. The school was included in the deal- - how fortunate!

June and I raised nine children, Michael, Kelly, Patrick, Thomas, Joan Philip, Robert, Janet and Daniele. They all graduated from St. Robert's School with the exception of Danny, who has down syndrome.

June was a beautiful Mezzo Soprano and sang at all the Latin Masses. Her favorite songs were Ave Maria and Panis Augelicus.

It was fun because of all the parish activities that everyone was involved in: Parish picnics at Blackberry Farm, the annual Variety Show where everyone was a star, the Festival "under the big tent", and all the other great times we had. It was a safe community because everyone knew everybody. The priests and sisters were part of everyone's family. Mothers and Fathers parented each others children and we always had to be on our best behavior. Sunday Masses, church holy days and receiving sacraments were huge in San Bruno and you could almost see our halos when we left St. Robert's Church after one of these occasions.

I was lucky enough to attend St. Robert School where I made many lifelong friends. Besides the three R's, we also had folk-dancing class with Mrs. Thompson every week, music class where we learned how to read music, and penmanship class where we were graded on the quality of our handwriting (no chicken-scratch at St. Bob's!!) We participated in May Day events, the annual Spirit Festival, First Friday breakfast (hot chocolate and donuts—Yum!) and hot dog days where the best steamed hot dogs EVER were served by room mothers. When we graduated from St. Robert's and moved on to many different high schools we maintained our friendships by getting together at St. Robert's Teen Club dances and activities.

Many years later when I became a mom, I knew I wanted my children to benefit from all St. Robert's had to offer. In true Monaghan tradition, they received their sacraments at St. Robert's, graduated from St. Roberts and I was able to witness history repeating itself.



# Living the Liturgu

#### The Feast of the Holy Trinity


Today's readings need a bit of background to be understood. Those of us who got our biblical history from Cecil B. DeMille might recall that in "The Ten Commandments" Moses comes down from the mountain to find a golden calf, made by his brother at the people's urging, and in his anger, Moses smashes the tablets on which God has inscribed the commandments. This passage comes after that, demonstrating both Moses' persistence and God's patient understanding. God does continue to "come along in our company," continuing his intimate relationship with Moses and the people. We might add that God has definitely "come along in our company" in a visible way through Jesus' life, death and resurrection and the sending of the Holy Spirit. The reading from Paul's letter to the Corinthians grows out of a division within the community between loyal followers of Paul and newcomers who are critical of Paul and want to take over the leadership. You can read II Corinthians 10-12 if you want the whole story. This passage was chosen, of course, because it mentions the Trinity. The citation for the gospel, John 3.16 shows up periodically on billboards and scoreboard and is, in reality, the heart of our faith: that God sent Jesus purely out of love for us. This passage doesn't mention the Spirit, though we might extrapolate that it is the Spirit who strengthens our believing, guides us in our faith, and shapes us into good instruments to show God's love to the world.

Lest we get caught in trying to "figure out" the Trinity, here is another thought. Simply put, the mystery of the Trinity is all about relationships. The Father loves the Son and the world and all its people, so sends us the Son to be our example of forgiveness and love unto death. Because everyone in all times and places will need wisdom and strength to live like Jesus, the Father and Son send us the Spirit. Just as in a family or community or parish, love is the binding force, not fear or coercion. We've grown up knowing we're made "in the image and likeness of God." We're made for relationships as our God is a community of relationships! May we reflect on our relationships this week, rejoicing in those which reflect those of the Trinity and asking forgiveness for those which don't.
