Walt & Mary Jane Gloistein

Being married in 1958 at St. Vincent de Paul's Church in San Francisco, we moved into our first and only home in Crestmoor Park in August of 1959 and would be celebrating 50 years of marriage at the same time as our St. Robert's Parish this year. Unfortunately, Mary Jane has been deceased for three years and therefore cannot enjoy this very important time for the Parish. We consider it a very important move for us nearly 50 years ago to locate on our court, in which the majority of our neighbors are Catholic and attend St. Robert's Church. Finding at that time that our parish would be St. Robert's, we have been blessed many times all of these years.

Walt grew up in San Francisco and graduated St. Anne's G.S., Saint Ignatius H.S. and U.S.F. where he received his degrees and credentials. He retired several years ago as a high school science teacher and finally as a H.S. principal. Mary Jane grew up in Mill Valley and San Leandro and graduated from Lone Mountain College and became a Clinical Laboratory Technologist. 

Acting on the Word

In the gospel today, Jesus stresses listening to his words and acting on them. Once the children are out of school, how does your daily life change? How will you help it to be both reflective and fruitful? Can you build in some activities for the grand/children which leave you some time for yourself? Can you ask a childless friend or neighbor to take the kids for an hour (which he or she would enjoy) and provide a break for you and the kids from each other?

If you'd like some spiritual enrichment via the internet, you can sign up for free, weekly reflections on the Sunday scriptures from a Dominican preacher at

jboll@preacherexchange.org. Fr. Jude who writes the reflections has a great way of giving both the cultural and linguistic background for the readings and their application to everyday life. Another excellent website is www.praythenews.org. The Carmelites of Indianapolis have many options on their home page: your prayer intentions, a reflection on some aspect of the news, a course in mindfulness, a description of contemplative life.

The Social Concerns group has set up Saturday July 12 from 10 am to 3 pm for a cleaning day at the Catholic Worker house here in San Bruno. We will have cleaning supplies available, so you just need to wear your old clothes and bring some elbow grease! We hope to paint the following two Saturdays and need help for those days as well. If you can't do the physical work, but would like to bring us lunch on any of those days, we'd be thrilled! Please let me know. If anyone would like to be involved, but cannot do any of these Saturdays, please contact me with a weekday suggestion and I'll find out if anyone else is available that same day.

Opportunities for Enrichment

The Lane Center for Catholic Studies and Social Thought at the University of San Francisco is hosting a summer lecture series on The Evolution of Moral Theology: 1900-1970. The speaker is Fr. James Keenan, SJ, a professor of theological ethics at Boston College; he has also taught at the University of Edinburgh, Princeton, the Gregorian University, Rome and Loyola School of Theology, Manila. He is a frequent contributor to America and Church magazines and has authored or edited many books on moral theology. He is the Chair of Catholic Theological Ethics in the World Church and an advisor to the Global AIDS Interfaith Alliance. The lectures will be given on Wednesdays from 5 to 6:30 pm on the Lone Mountain Campus; the topic for July 2 is "The Moral Manuals and Moral Pathology;" on July 9, "Innovation;" and on July 16th, "From Confessing Sins to Liberating Consciences." I'm planning, God willing, to attend the first and last and would be happy for company! Please let me know if you'd like to come.

The Summer Home Retreat at Mercy Center is still accepting people to participate July 21 through July 25. In this type of retreat, you live your usual life at home or school or work, committing to build in a time of reflection and prayer each day and a daily meeting with a spiritual director at a convenient time. Parishioners who have had this experience have found it very helpful. If you're wondering what you'd talk about with someone, the focus of spiritual direction is your life, especially your relationship with God: how is your prayer going? How are you integrating your faith with your everyday life and relationships? The person doesn't tell you what to do, but listens with you to what God might be saying to you at this point in your life. Please ask me for a flier if you might be interested. I meet with a spiritual director each month and find it very helpful. She gives me insights and suggestions which I'd never have come up with on my own. *Peace, S. Sheral*
