

# St. Robert's Parish Celebrates 50 Years













We continue to build our Church

#### Dear Parishioners,

On June 8, 1958 the first Mass was celebrated in the unnamed Church at the corner of Oak Avenue and Crystal Springs Road. Everyone presumed this new Church would bear the name of the school which was opened nine years before. But Archbishop Mitty had a different idea. The area was rapidly growing. A new parish was to be established with the name Saint Robert of the House of God. Some of the people of Saint Bruno's Church were angry and others were disappointed. All their hard work to build a school and a new Church would be handed over to the new parish family. Families who lived within the territorial boundaries of St. Roberts were told that they must come to the new parish. This was their parish now. The people who lived within the territorial boundaries of St. Bruno's were told the Saint Bruno's was their parish.

The parish boundaries meant everything in those days. The four houses at the corner of 30<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Pacheco in San Francisco were all in different parishes. If your best friend lived across the street, you could not go to their parish school because you lived outside the parish boundaries. Today your parish is determined in one of two ways: the address where you live or the parish in which you register. If a family is not registered in any parish, your home parish is determined geographically.

Today Saint Robert's Parish celebrates fifty years of service to the community of San Bruno. We continue the work which was begun in 1907 when Saint Bruno's became a mission Church and in 1912 it was established as a parish. We have much to be grateful for. Our thanks begins with the parish community of Saint Bruno. It was their faith, determination and hard work which gave birth Saint Robert's. There are many people still living who were part of the St. Bruno community and in 1958 formed the founding community of Saint Robert's. At the 11:30 a.m. Anniversary Mass many of these founders will be wearing carnations.

Over the years the community of St. Robert's continues to grow. New ministries have been established. Since 1958 we have celebrated 5206 Baptisms, 5598 First Communions, 3460 Confirmations, 1535 Weddings and 2132 Funerals.

God has blessed our parish family with superb leadership which continues to serve through various parish organizations and ministries. As we celebrate these fifty years of building our community we ask for God's blessing upon each and every one of you for making our parish the special family it really is.



# Living the Liturgy

#### God's Call

Happy Anniversary! And may God bless everyone in the past 50 years, living and dead, whose faith and love and dedication has made our parish the great place that it is! May we continue to welcome newcomers, strengthen each other's faith and invite each other to even greater generosity towards our neighbors in need.

This is the 10<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time, that long segment of the liturgical year between Pentecost and Advent. The "ordinary" part means "counted" like ordinal numbers. During this period of six and a half months. God will continue to be active in our individual lives and in our life as a parish. People often make pilgrimages to Lourdes or Fatima or Rome, yet if we believe in the incarnation – Jesus becoming a human being like us – it seems that God wants to be with us where we live. Through Jesus' coming, he has blessed the very ordinary, uneventful activities of our everyday lives. God is hidden, perhaps, in the preparation of a meal for the family or friends; in the babysitting of our grandchildren; in the volunteering at Café St. Vincent; in the listening to a colleague at work or an acquaintance at school. The beauty of summer may cause us to pause at the brilliance of the sunset, the sparkle of the stars or the calming blue of the Bay. May we have eyes to see!

Today's gospel includes the call of Matthew whom Jesus addresses as he sits at his table, collecting his "cut" as well as the taxes for the Roman occupiers. He is called, we might say, in the midst of his extortion! Jesus must have seen something in Matthew to have called him not only to follow, but also to become one of those who will spread the message. And who better to speak about forgiveness and a change of heart than one who had experienced both in his own person? Jesus not only calls him to follow, but eats with him and his tax collector friends, a practice which in Middle Eastern culture carried the weight of acceptance. (Matthew may have toyed with the idea of following Jesus before this, but had continued his lucrative occupation while he thought things over!) And imagine the change it was for him to go from being a wealthy tax collector to a vagabond, traveling with someone who had "nowhere to lay his head"? Jesus' reasserts to the critical Pharisees his common practice of eating with tax collectors and sinners. Perhaps, he wants to give them the choice we heard about last week, to choose a blessing or a curse. Perhaps, he trusts that if they can experience being truly accepted and respected, they will choose life, they will choose God's law of obedience and integrity.

How about us? When did we first respond to the call to follow Christ, to really live as a committed Christian? The realization of God's call comes to different people at different times, but often with the experience of suffering. Can we re-commit ourselves to our belief that God has promised to be with us and will keep that promise, no matter what? If we feel that our faith is weak, can we pray that it be strengthened? Can we lean on this faith community and the Eucharist to see us through?
