Dear Parishioners,

On this Sunday, we celebrate the Solemnity of St. Peter and St. Paul, Apostles commissioned by the Lord Jesus Christ to preach the Good News to the ends of the earth. They are two unlikely men to have been called and chosen by Jesus. Many would argue that they should never have been called and chosen to share in the mission and ministry of Jesus. St. Peter had no particular skills in life besides fishing. That was all that he knew in life. He was not well educated. He lacked the necessary experience and ability to be a leader of any group. St. Paul persecuted and killed Christians. He had no regard for human life. Innocent blood drenched his hands. Both St Peter and St. Paul had many faults and weaknesses. Yet, Jesus saw great things in them. Jesus calls the least of this world to share in the work of God.

St. Peter becomes the head and leader of the Apostles and of the early Christian community. He is the first bishop of Rome, the Vicar of Christ. As the leader, St. Peter instills unity to an ever growing and expanding Catholic Church. He shepherds the People of God as Christ commanded, "Feed my sheep. Tend my flock." St. Paul is the Apostle to the gentile world. His work builds up Christ's body in such communities as Corinth, Galatia, Rome, Ephesus, and Thessalonica. His letters inspire and instruct the early Christian community to live and practice their faith in the Risen Lord.

What the two great saints and Apostles of the Church have is tremendous faith in Christ Jesus. Their lives were not easy. They were persecuted and imprisoned over the course of their respective lives. No matter what hardships they experienced and endured, they kept their eyes fixed on Christ at all times. They both ran and finished the race. St. Peter and St. Paul realized that they were weak and frail human beings. The risen Lord was their strength. Christ filled their hearts with his grace. They turned to the Lord and prayed constantly and fervently.

Who do we turn to in our time of need? Where do we draw our strength when we are weak? Do we rely solely on ourselves or other things? In the words of St. Peter, "To whom shall we go? Lord, you have the words of everlasting life." In the words of St. Paul, "When I am powerless, it is then that I am strong in the Lord Jesus Christ."






Living the Liturgy

Giving One's Life

The first reading last weekend was striking; Jeremiah isn't paranoid, but is actually facing death from those who oppose him. He has spoken the truth to those in power and they don't like it. He has called the people and their rulers back to worshipping God sincerely and treating the poor with justice. No wonder people called Jesus a prophet, since his words echoed those of the prophets who had gone before him and produced the same opposition!

Perhaps, you thought of Sr. Dorothy Stang, SND who was killed by powerful people in the Amazon forest of Brazil. She fearlessly worked with peasants eking out a living almost as serfs for the wealthy landowners. She was restoring their sense of dignity by teaching them the scriptures and the principles of community organizing. She was cautioned many times by those who loved her that it was a dangerous task on which she was embarking. How rarely we think of the scriptures as revolutionary or life-threatening to the preacher! But those whose self-esteem depended on the slavery of others were not about to let their workers have a rightful share in the proceeds of their labor. So they hired underlings to shoot her as she walked home with some companions from a meeting. She opened her bible as they approached with their guns and began to read aloud, "Blessed are the poor in spirit..." Today's passage from Matthew's gospel declares, "Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father." Surely, Dorothy has been welcomed home by the God she so loved. She is, no doubt, pleased to know that the government of Brazil has finally designated some of the forest for the livelihood of the peasants.

What about us? Even in our individualistic society with its mistaken sense that everyone's opinion is of equal value, can we speak the truth that our faith teaches us? We need to be grounded in our own loving relationship with God so that we don't sound like the televangelists who approach the very persons they are trying to convert with a condemnatory attitude. Can we say something when someone's human dignity is denied in conversation, whether an unborn child or a Guantanamo detainee? As we watch our own buying habits, can we at least pray for those who find that the high prices of food and fuel are not just inconvenient, but actually forcing them to choose between nutritious food and paying the rent? With the poor of the world suffering terribly from the high cost of wheat, corn and other staples, might we log onto www.bread.org to find out about the Global Poverty Act? Peace, Sister Sheral
