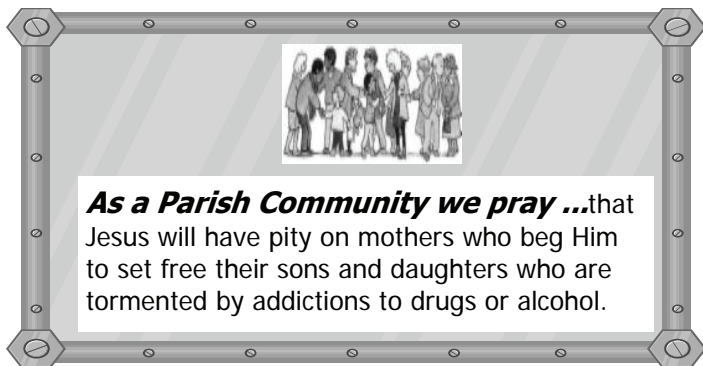

MISSIONARY SUNDAY

Next weekend, August 23-24, 2008, we will have a representative from the Mary Mother of God Mission, Mary Joe Peyton, speaking about the mission in the Far East of Russia.

In the early part of this century, the Russian Far East boasted a thriving Roman Catholic population. Many Russians, Poles, Lithuanians, and other groups inhabited the area and had built school, hospitals, and beautiful churches. Then the Russian revolution swept into the region. After the revolution of 1917, Siberia became a showplace of the new Communist era, a land without churches and without God. Under Stalin, all Catholic churches were confiscated, and many were turned into the most degrading uses imaginable. Catholics were murdered by the thousands and their bodies dumped into mass graves. Cemeteries were turned into amusement parks.

Two American priests, Fr. Myron Effing, CJD and Fr. Daniel Maurer, CJD, arrived in Vladivostok in 1992 to help re-establish the Church in this region. They currently pastor three Catholic parishes in an area covering thousands of square miles. Now that the foundations have been laid, additional priests and sisters are joining the work, and parishes are growing and multiplying.

Living the Liturgy

Why Are We Here?

The reading about Elijah last weekend omitted a wonderful question which the Lord asks him, "Why are you here?" Elijah, of course, has run away from people seeking his life and thus, ended up in the cave. But the question the Lord asks is a good one for us as the summer winds down. Why are we here? Those of us who cut our teeth on the Baltimore Catechism (published in 1884) may remember the answer to "Why did God make you?" "To know, love and serve him in this life and be happy with him forever in the next." While it was written a long time ago, the answer still has relevance for us today.

If we are here to know God, how does the Holy Spirit help us to do that? Surely, prayer, daily Mass and the reading of the scriptures are wonderful ways to open ourselves to God. I'd suggest that reflection on our daily experiences is another. Any time we feel a strong emotion, whether sadness, joy, anger, awe or fear, there is a message for us; God is trying to tell us something. Of course, if we live with the radio or television on or are constantly on the computer or iPOD, we will probably not be tuned into our feelings. The noise or our own busyness can easily drown out the voice of God. We need to stop when we experience one of these feelings and take the time to ask, "What are you trying to say to me, God?" It takes practice, like anything worth doing, but once you begin, it gets easier each time.

And how do we love and serve him? By loving and serving each other, of course, first of all, those closest at hand for whom we have responsibility. Remember the idea of the "duties of our state in life"? That was another way of examining our consciences to see if we were responding to God's particular call to each of us. Now that we have a heightened awareness of our interconnectedness with one another globally, we know that our love and service needs to go beyond just those we know to the brothers and sisters we've never met.

So, if you can, take a few minutes this weekend to reflect on your response to the Lord's question: Why are you here?
