Dear Parishioners,

Sunday's gospel refers to Jesus' crucifixion as a "lifting up." "When I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw all people to myself. He said this to show by what death he was to die."

The cross, an instrument of state execution, symbolizes our Christian faith that Jesus' death and resurrection opens to us a new life.

The wood of the cross symbolizes our salvation. In Jesus, God becomes one of us and by his incarnation unites himself with every human. "He worked with human hands, thought with a human mind, acted with a human will, and loved with a human heart."

Minnie Jensen, a friend, died at 50, having battled cancer for almost 20 of her years, including a radiation burn from early treatment that never healed. She married at 16 without finishing high school. The youngest of her six children was two when she first had surgery for breast cancer. Wanting to see her children grow up kept Minnie struggling to live. Minnie came from a singing family and usually instigated the singling at parties, funerals, and weddings. For her own funeral, she chose hymns whose lyrics she had lived and that expressed her understanding of her life. At the wake, her youngest daughter sang "Love Lifted Me." "When I was down and out, love lifted me." Minnie found in the last line of the chorus a statement that made sense of her suffering. "I'll turn in my cross for a crown." Her songs trace how she identified her suffering with Jesus' suffering in firm Christian hope that resurrection follows. Jesus saves us by showing us how to love one another. We can listen to one another's stories, share another's hurt, and lift one another's spirits. The risen Jesus lives and saves us in our love for one another.



WEEKLY READINGS

Living the Liturgy

Exaltation of the Cross

The cross is such a mixed blessing for us, as Fr. Bruce shared with the little ones recently. It was a disgraceful instrument of death, reserved for only the worst criminals. Yet for us who believe, it is the symbol of a love which knows no bounds. The reading from Philippians reminds us that Jesus "emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness…he humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, death on a cross." What a great act of trust in his Father!

Sometimes, we forget that Jesus, though he was the Son of God, faced death as a human being with the same thoughts and fears as we have. Perhaps, he wondered if he had done everything his Father wanted him to do. Perhaps, he was concerned about whether the disciples motley crew that they were – would be able to carry on his mission of proclaiming the good news of the kingdom. Since he had probably seen other executions, he may have prayed that he would have the courage to go through such a horrendous death for the life of the world. We need to lean on our faith and Jesus' example as we struggle with our own impending death or the death of those we love. Nothing is in vain. As Jesus' suffering and dying brought life to the world, all the suffering and dying that seems so pointless to us is taken up, made holy and fruitful in the suffering and dying of Jesus. May we strengthen each other with our faith that new life will come! Peace, S. Sheral
