

Dear Parishioners,

Next week, on Tuesday, we will join our fellow citizens in casting our ballots for the office of President of the United States, for members of Congress as well as for or against various propositions that are being presented to us as citizens. The right to vote is one of the great responsibilities that has been given to us in a democracy - a right we should not take lightly. Our responsibility goes beyond casting our votes. We should also pray for the ones whom we elect to political office. In 1791, Bishop John Carroll, the first Bishop in the United States wrote a beautiful prayer for elected officials which for many years was recited at every Mass throughout our new country. Perhaps, we should do it again.

"We pray thee, O God of might, wisdom, and justice through whom authority is rightly administered, laws are enacted, and judgment decreed, assist with Thy holy spirit of counsel and fortitude the President of the United States, that his administration may be conducted in righteousness, and be eminently useful to Thy people over whom he presides; by encouraging due respect for virtue and religion; by a faithful execution of the laws in justice and mercy; and by restraining vice and immorality. Let the light of Thy divine wisdom direct the deliberations of Congress, and shine forth in all the proceedings and laws framed for our rule and government, so they might tend to the preservation of peace, the promotion of national happiness, the increase of industry, sobriety, and useful knowledge; and may they perpetuate to us the blessings of equal liberty."

In the days and weeks ahead, we might say this prayer or one of our own for the President and for other elected officials.



Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will take place in our Church, following the 8:30AM Mass on Saturday, November 1st. It will conclude with benediction at 10:00AM.

November is traditionally the month set aside by our church to commemorate and celebrate the memories of our departed loved ones. This year "The Feast of All Souls" falls on Sunday so we will celebrate our departed loved ones at **all** the Masses that weekend:

Saturday Nov. 1, @ 4:30 p.m. Mass & at all Masses on Sunday, November 2, 2008.

- (1) The names of those buried from St. Robert's and elsewhere this past year will be written on a scroll, framed and then placed in the sanctuary under the Pascal Candle instead of being read aloud. We, currently, have over a hundred names and it is not feasible to read that list aloud at each Mass.
- (2) A special shrine erected in Our Lady's alcove (in the church) with their names inscribed in a Memorial Book. Please, bring pictures, memorial cards or flowers to place in this shrine all during November. This is especially for those who passed away prior to this current year (as well as the current year).
- **(3)** We will have a special *Wall of Remembrance*. We post the names of those who died during the period November 1, 2007 October 31, 2008 around the walls of the church, so that the faithful will be reminded of our departed loved ones each time they enter Saint Robert's Church.

Living the Liturgy

More on Paul

I owe these comments and last week's to Fr. Ron Witherup, SS who has written several books on Paul and who recently spoke at the Pauline Bookstore in Redwood City. Paul was born in the diaspora, not in the heart of Israel and was trilingual, speaking Greek, Aramaic and Hebrew. He was trained as a Pharisee. He was an ardent persecutor of the followers of the Way (the name given the early Christians), though we don't know exactly why. We may remember the story of his dramatic conversion, being stopped in his tracks and asked, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?" (Acts 22.8) Though it seems as though he immediately began preaching, that was not the case. Members of the Christian community took him off to Nabatiya (possibly to rescue him from the families of those he had been persecuting) to give him some much-needed training as a Christian. We won't find parables or miracles in Paul's writings and he barely mentions Jesus whom he probably never met. But he does write a lot about the cross and the Risen Christ and about the importance of baptism and the Holy Spirit. But more on that next week...
