

A few weeks ago, 18 Ladies, 11 from St. Robert's including myself, ventured to Ireland to visit Sister Mary O'Donnell who retired from St. Robert's in June 2006 and returned to the Presentation Convent in Thurles County, Tipperary Ireland. Amongst tears, hugs and very happy memories we bid farewell. Sister Mary's visit was definitely the highlight of our trip. Sister Mary continues to touch our lives from afar.




JOIN US FOR THANKSGIVING MASS

Living the Liturgy

The Feast of Christ the King

Today's gospel should make us uncomfortable. This is the last Sunday of the Church's liturgical year. Matthew's community places it immediately before the Passion, so it sums up Jesus' teaching ministry. We know it almost by heart: "I was hungry and you gave me to eat. I was thirsty and you gave me to drink." We can surely use this passage to encourage our children to share their lunch with someone who has forgotten hers or to split the last bit of milk with their brother. But for us adults, it surely means more than these simple acts of kindness. Jesus speaks of being a stranger, naked, ill and imprisoned. What is my attitude towards someone who sounds or looks like a foreigner, who seems different? Do I turn away from the homeless person, not naked, but in soiled clothing? Do I refuse to visit someone who is seriously ill because it reminds me of my own mortality? Might God be inviting me to deal with that reality through being present to this person who may be on his way home to God? What is my attitude towards those in prison or jail? Can I see prisoners as human beings, someone's father, brother, sister or son? Are they, their families and victims ever included in my prayer? I'm sure you've noticed that this passage begins with a courtroom scene. This really is what we will be judged on, period. None of us responds to Jesus in all his different disguises, but we need to at least open our hearts and minds and pocketbooks to him in as many different kinds of people as we can. Thank you for your generosity to the St. Vincent de Paul food drive which helps to feed Jesus in our hungry neighbors and to the Catholic Campaign for Human Development which funds projects in poor communities here at home.

We will have many opportunities in the coming weeks of Advent to respond to Jesus' presence in people who are poor by donating warm accessories for the people who are homebound and by participating in the Giving Trees. This year, the Social Concerns group will enable us to assist our worldwide brothers and sisters by offering Catholic Relief Services Fair Trade coffee, distributed by Earth Friendly Coffee, and chocolate bars from Divine Chocolate.
