Dear Parishioners,

Another year of drought, we may exclaim, sighing. Our growing population, the lack of rain and new regulations are making our lack of water a major issue for all Californians. We need to think of installing low-flow shower heads and toilets, careful to use the water we do need as the precious resource it is.

We all realize that water is critical for human survival and for improving the lives of people who are poor. One of the United Nations Millennium Development Goals is to reduce by half the percentage of people without access to basic sanitation and clean water. Globally, one billion people have no access to safe drinking water, so understandably, water-related sicknesses claim more lives than AIDS or malaria. 6,000 persons a day and 2 million children a year die of typhoid, cholera and other water-borne diseases. 40 billion hours a year are spent by girls and women hauling water from polluted streams, often 5 miles away. A byproduct of this drudgery is that it prevents them from attending school.

Next weekend, the parish Social Concerns group will be showing a video highlighting the needs of sub-Saharan Africans for clean, safe water. But we needn't feel helpless. Some practical, concerned people have invented what they call PlayPumps to begin to address this tragedy. A hydrologist comes to a rural area, often with a school, to find an appropriate place for a well. The borehole is dug (up to 100 meters or 300 ft. down); piping, a water tank (holding 2500 liters) and merry go round are installed by local folks and, as the kids play, the water is pumped out of the ground and into the tank! Women come and get the fresh, clean water from the tap. (You'll see a diagram and photos in the sanctuary.) The tank has two sides for paid advertising which pays for the upkeep and two sides for health-related reminders. The assembly is guaranteed for at least 10 years. 900 pumps have already been installed in South Africa (where they are made), Mozambigue, Zambia and Swaziland. The hope is to have another 3100 PlavPumps by 2010 in Ethiopia, Kenya, Lesotho, Malawi, Tanzania and Uganda. One well costs \$14,000 to install.

We ask that as your almsgiving practice for Lent, you place in the envelopes in the pews the money you have saved from whatever your Lenten sacrifice is. You may put it in the collection every week or wait until the end of Lent. Thank you in advance for your generosity!



WEEKLY READINGS

Living the Liturgy

Lepers Then, Lepers Today

The readings this weekend are about exclusion. When we hear the gruesome description of leprosy in the first reading, we could wonder why it was included! We might contrast our response to that of Jesus in the gospel. The leper begs to be made clean and Jesus is moved with pity, touches him and responds, "I will do it. Be made clean." The reading raises lots of guestions: If the leper was to be dwelling apart and to announce his presence with the ringing of a bell, how did he get so close to Jesus? Why didn't the disciples keep him away from Jesus, unclean as he was? How dare Jesus touch him, risking leprosy himself and disobeying the laws of ritual cleanliness! And why does Jesus tell him not to tell anyone? [The man does need to go to the priest and make the customary offering so that he can be welcomed back into the community.] Jesus' telling those healed not to share their experience with anyone is called the "Marcan Secret" since Mark's gospel is the only one in which we hear this admonition. Scholars tell us that it was probably that Jesus didn't want to be known as merely a miracle worker, but wanted people to follow him because of his message, not to witness his wondrous acts.

Readings like these should prompt us to ask ourselves who we exclude from our care and concern. With the overcrowding of our state's prisons, and the likelihood of early release for many inmates, articles have appeared giving us some insights into who these people are. The statistics I read made me think again about my attitude towards those millions of inmates in our country, the highest percentage of any developed nation. According to many studies, 75% are high school drop outs; 80% are victims of child or sexual abuse; 90% are addicted or alcoholic or both. Their average reading level is between 4th and 7th grade and, not surprisingly, once they are released, 70% are re-arrested.

The Children's Defense Fund has an effort called Cradle to Prison Pipeline in which they warn of the frightening relationship of poverty, lack of a high school education, child abuse, juvenile incarceration and community violence. "A Black boy born in 2001 has a 1 in 3 chance of going to prison in his lifetime; a Latino boy, a 1 in 6 chance; and a White boy, a 1 in 17 chance. A Black girl born in 2001 has a 1 in 17 chance of going to prison; a Latino girl, a 1 in 45 chance; and a White girl, a 1 in 111 chance. The urgent challenge for each of us and our nation is to prevent this waste of our children's lives and our nation's capabilities." Even if we didn't care about them as children of God, our state spends 20 times as much per youth in a state juvenile facility than for a student in a public school. But if we believe the scriptures and follow the example of Jesus, we need to recognize that these are our children.
