Living the Liturgy

Widen the Tent

Peter in today's reading from the Acts of the Apostles expresses a monumental shift: "I see that God shows no partiality." This statement coming from a good Jew who felt that, as the chosen people, God did show partiality to his people, must have shocked his hearers. But the action of the Holy Spirit and Peter's recognition of that fact, changed him. This reminds me of the sense so many of us grew up with that only Catholics would go to heaven; we thought we needed to "buy" pagan babies in order to bring them with us! (In reality, we were helping to support missionaries, but that fact may have been lost on us as children.) Hopefully, we now have a clearer sense of God's all-encompassing goodness and his desire that everyone know of that love. Is there anyone we have judged as beyond the scope of God's love? Or not deserving of our love? May the same Spirit who changed Peter's mind and heart, change ours as well!

Love One Another

Today's gospel repeats a saying of Jesus which we know by heart: "This I command you: love one another." The many difficult situations in our nation and our world give us ample opportunity to express that love for people close at hand and far away. In addition to "hands on" responses to the needs of our neighbors, legislation is another expression of our concern for the rest of the human family. The document "Faithful Citizenship" from our country's bishops reminded us that being faithful citizens includes not only our obligation to vote, but also to be active participants in our democratic society. One aspect of that obligation is advocacy, finding ways of expressing our values as Catholics to our legislative leaders and to our President. Most of us have never done that and wouldn't know where to start. I had the opportunity in October to participate in a Catholic Relief Service training program and am now on a committee to pass along some of that experience to other people in our archdiocese.

If you'd like to learn how to voice your concerns about global poverty, right to life issues, the death penalty, immigration or any other issue, please come to the training workshop we're sponsoring. It will take place on Thursday, May 28 at St. Dunstan's, Millbrae from 6 pm to 9 pm and will offer some basic tools for advocacy. We offered this training last month and the participants found it very helpful. We'll have a light supper and I guarantee it won't seem like three hours! If you work with St. Vincent de Paul, Respect Life, are taking social justice class, or just want to be a more participative citizen, please come. I will have fliers this weekend, so please see me if you'd like more information or give me a call at the rectory. Thank you.
