Summer is here! Once again, we sit on our deck sipping mango tea as we talk about today's readings.

In the Gospel of Mark, we find a connection with what is going on in our lives. The woman afflicted with hemorrhages for 12 years touches Jesus' cloak and believes that she will be healed. As she does this, the flow of blood stops. Jesus says to her: "Daughter, your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction". Gene has had bone marrow cancer for the past 12 years. A few mornings ago, he had a heavy nose bleed...this happens because his hemoglobin and platelets are so very low. We confidently asked Jesus to stop the bleeding until we could get to his ENT doctor. The bleeding stopped! Once again, this caring doctor cauterized Gene's nasal passage. The Holy Spirit often works through doctors and other members of the medical profession. Miracles do happen when we believe and pray.

In the past nine months, Gene has received 54 units of blood. We thank all of you who have donated your blood. It is keeping Gene and others alive. Gene's Oncologist has begun a new treatment to wake up his bone marrow. We pray that it will work soon and he won't need any more transfusions. We thank each of you who pray for Gene's healing.

We read of Jarius and his daughter. Jarius falls at Jesus feet and pleads earnestly with Him, saying: "My daughter is at the point of death. Please, come lay Your hands on her that she may get well and live." The people from Jarius' house were sure that his daughter had died. Jesus tells Jarius: "Do not be afraid; just have faith." Jesus takes the little girl by the hand and tells her: "Little girl, I say to you, arise!" This she does; then walks around the room. So many times, Gene has snapped back when he seemed to be at a very low point. If we get discouraged, Jesus says to us: "Do not be afraid; just have faith."

We don't know what the future holds for us; but we will keep pressing forward, remembering our many other victories. We do not see what God is doing; but we know that He loves us and is with us. We have discovered that faith coupled with love and sense of humor is what makes for a joyful life even in the midst of trial and pain. We enjoy each day we spend together and we laugh a lot.

Hope-Pray-Believe-Trust—God loves you and so do we.

Living the Liturgy

A New Creation

Did you hear the second reading last weekend? St. Paul makes this wonderful statement in his writing to the Corinthians: "Whoever is in Christ is a new creation: the old things have passed away; behold, new things have come." (II Cor. 5.17) Now that summer is here and, hopefully at least for some of us, a slower pace, we might have a chance to ponder that statement. What are the "old things" that need to be set aside so that I might make room in my life for the "new things" which God is eager to give me? What stands in the way of my living fully the life of Christ which began for me in baptism? Old attitudes, old prejudices, an old sense of myself which says I'm not worthy of God's love, so I stay away from church and avoid praying because God isn't interested in me!

In today's reading from II Corinthians Paul reminds us that "Jesus Christ, though he was rich, for your sake became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich." The question of how we use what we have – our finances, our time, our possessions – may make us uncomfortable. Especially at this moment when we all know people who are struggling, how might we respond? With listening hearts and supportive words, for sure, and, perhaps, by passing on to neighbors the clothes we haven't worn for some time or sharing some of the food items we've bought at Costco. *Peace, S. 


