Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Since this is my first time to write something for the Sunday bulletin, I am taking this opportunity to introduce myself to the parish community here at St. Robert's.

I was ordained for the Diocese of Lucena in the Philippines on April 5, 1983. Last year I celebrated my 25th ordination anniversary while serving as pastor of St. Peter Parish in Pacifica. I came to San Francisco on April 5, 1995 to join my parents who lived for a short while in the City. My parents went home to the Philippines for good in November 2000, and I stayed.

St. Robert's is my sixth parish assignment, after St. Patrick's in San Francisco, St. Andrew's in Daly City, St. Augustine's in South San Francisco, Immaculate Heart of Mary in Belmont and St. Peter's in Pacifica. I would like to thank Archbishop George Neiderauer and our pastor, Msgr. Bruce Dreier for giving me the opportunity to serve as parish administrator here at St. Robert's.

My family and friends call me Obet. Obet is actually short for Robert. You just remove the r's and you are left with o-b-e-t. Obet is a popular nick name for Roberto in the Philippines. I have never been called Roberto except when my mother was mad at me because I did something naughty as a child-but that was then. I became my mother's favorite son when I entered the seminary after 6th grade but that is not why I entered the seminary. I was excited about living in the seminary, so I stayed in the seminary for thirteen years. The reason why I persevered is because I enjoyed seminary life. Enjoying seminary life is a good indication that the seed of vocation to the priesthood is growing. Many of my classmates in the seminary left after a year or two because they were homesick all the time, not contented with seminary life.

Before moving to San Francisco in 1995, I was pastor twice from 1984 and 1994 and served as a school chaplain for five years in the Philippines. I am happy to be here and I look forward to a fruitful ministry with the help of God's grace and with your support and cooperation. I could not have been in a better place at this time. Our parish patron saint is my namesake and my birthday falls on the feast day of San Bruno. Well, you will have to figure out when is San Bruno's feast day.


Communion for the Sick

WEEKLY READINGS

Living the Liturgy

Called by God

The readings today continue the theme of being called. The letter to the Ephesians 1.3-14, is well worth reading several times during the week. It speaks of God blessing us – all of us - with everything we need to be holy and reminds us that we are already saved, so we don't need to be scrupulous about every small fault we may have. We don't need to "earn" salvation; it has been given to us as a free gift! We live moral lives because God has loved us, not to convince God to love us. We're part of God's plan, so we need to rely on the Holy Spirit who has been given to us to guide us to be his presence and do his work. Remember Fr. Marini's lovely intercession: "That the Holy Spirit may guide us in all that we say and all that we do"? Obviously, his living of that prayer has contributed to his being the loving, gentle priest he is.

The gospel speaks of Jesus sending the Twelve out two by two, since companionship will help them to keep their hopes high and if one falters, the other can help! "Take nothing for the journey" nudges us to look at our many possessions, the "stuff" which clutters our closets and our lives. Might we recycle much of it to those who could use it?

The last sentence of the gospel says: "The Twelve drove out many demons..." One of the demons much in the news lately has been the practice of torture. Pope Benedict XVI has said that "the prohibition against torture 'cannot be contravened under any circumstance.'" (quoted Jan. 14, 2009 by John Carr, Director of Justice, Peace and Human Development for the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops) I had the opportunity recently to learn more about torture. San Francisco and San Jose have Centers for Survivors of Torture and several of the speakers were psychologists or torture survivors from one of these centers. A former interrogator for the Army also answered many of the questions around the use of torture. The interrogator related that from 1993 until 2002, those in his work were forbidden to use torture and repeatedly told that it doesn't work. He insisted that the slow process of establishing a relationship with the source and gaining their trust is the only way to get reliable, accurate information. A person being tortured will say anything to make the torture stop. The "ticking bomb" scenario was also explored in which a suspect supposedly has information about a ticking bomb or other deadly force which could prevent the deaths of many people. [Many Americans would approve of the use of torture in this situation.] The interrogator responded that the informant could easily use the opportunity to identify someone he has a grudge against as the perpetrator; thus, that person's life is ruined and the danger is not averted. Military leaders themselves have come out against the use of torture, realizing that, in addition to being forbidden by the Geneva Conventions and the United Nations Convention against Torture to which we are signatories, it makes our service personnel targets for revenge and fuels international hatred. A NOTE FROM FATHER NNANNA



Dear Parishioners,

When I went back to Nigeria last year, my Bishop said I could take my annual leave in Nigeria or overseas. I was happy that I can visit St. Robert's family again. My first Missionary journey is still fresh for I keep adding one impression or the other in my Sermons.

I am happy to be back, though for a few weeks, which is better than not coming at all.

My parish, St. Theresa Akaeze in Abakaliki Diocese of Nigeria, is made up of 8 Missions. Our census is about two thousand on paper. We have two Masses on Sundays and same during the week. We have lay readers but no Eucharistic Ministers. For the weekday Masses I bless water, pray and anoint the sick and the needy. I carried the devotion to our Lady of Perpetual Help to my parish. Only few of us read the prayers while 90% wait for the dismissal hymn and the blessings. Our number is about 60.

The quest for spiritual satisfaction made me hold Adoration to the Blessed Sacrament on Fridays from 4pm to 6pm. They have it because I bathe them with Holy Water, intercessory prayers and anointing. They are allowed to give Testimonies for what God has done for them.

Again I am happy to be back for I have enough time to pray, reflect and share with you. Thanks to Msgr. Bruce for his brotherly love and care.
