Dear Friends,

"Who is she that comes forth as the morning rising, fair as the moon, bright as the sun. terrible as an army set in battle array?"

Every August Catholics around the world celebrate the Queenship of Mary or Regina Caeli. This feast of Mary falls seven days after the feast of the Assumption, August 22. What a beautiful and honored title for Mary.

We meditate and we reflect on these titles when we pray the Glorious Mysteries of the Rosary: Mary is assumed into Heaven and Mary is crowned Queen of Heaven and Earth. Tradition tells us that Our Heavenly Father crowned Mary the very next day after she was assumed into heaven. In the Old Testament we read "and the Queen stands at your right hand dressed in gold of Ophir" Today we see this as describing Mary our mother and queen.

When Our Lord Jesus Christ was about to take leave of His Apostles and Disciples He told them not to be disturbed or frightened because He was going to prepare a place for them with His Heavenly Father. In my Father's house there are many mansions -- Mansions of infinite happiness and peace. There will be no more jealousy or greed in our heavenly abode. Each will be eternally happy in his/her mansion because we will be in full fellowship with our Heavenly Father.

We reflect on Father Bruce Dreier enjoying his heavenly mansion this week. His suffering is over and he is at peace. We ask him to intercede with Our Lord and His Blessed Mother for his family, staff, friends and parishioners.

Mary Queen of Heaven, pray for Father Bruce and for all of us your children.



New Parish Directory is Planned.



At the vigil and the funeral, the combined choirs of St. Robert's, Epiphany, and St. Cecilia's sang, "There are many rooms in my Father's house. Do not be afraid and have no doubt; I am going there to prepare a place. Come and follow me, come and you will see, come and take your rest in God's safe embrace." How consoling to remember that he is safe and sound now, with the God he served enthusiastically and with such great love. The reflections shared Monday evening were so touching. He obviously led from within the communities he served, never standing apart or orchestrating activities from afar. God's love for him and his love for God overflowed into his love for us.

Each of us has our own memories of him. For some, it was the regular conversations after Mass each Sunday; for others, it was the particular homily which was just what we needed to hear. It may have been his counseling for a family problem or his presence at a special celebration; his visit to a dying parent or the celebration of First Communion. He loved the yearly Passion Play and we noticed that he was close to tears when he thanked the young people and their directors on Good Friday. He celebrated the Eucharist with us as long as he could. He thoroughly enjoyed the monthly family Mass and always managed to address the children in such a way that we adults got the point as well!

The outpouring of involvement and love these past days speaks more eloquently than words. We were blest to have him as our pastor for five years. We are a stronger community because of his leadership and his presence with us. We have been blessed to have Fr. Obet here to help us through this difficult time. May we console and encourage each other as Fr. Bruce would want us to do. Peace, S. Sheral
