#### Dear Parishioners,

Let us be mindful of those who have ministered to us in Jesus' name, and give thanks for the ways in which through them we have experienced the power of God's all-inclusive love. Sunday's gospel passage begins after this lesson. The disciple John raises a question about who can act in Jesus' name. John sounds as if he is tattling, when he reports,

"Teacher, someone is casting out demons in your name."

Jesus demonstrates who is greatest by taking a child in his arms and insisting,

"Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me,"

Jesus claims broad middle ground in this saying, "Whoever is not against us is for us."

Middle ground is where we explore what we have in common with others, what they have experienced, why they think the way they do. Middle ground is where people share their stories. What is the experience of a suburban stay at home mom, a refugee from Somalia in a foreign culture, and undocumented immigrants working a minimum-wage job at a hotel, an African American nurse who has experienced people shunning his or her touch?

Middle ground is where real people replace stereotypes and liberate each other from the demons of prejudice and unexamined certainty. Middle ground is where someone else's lived experience can broaden and transform our own. In these ways Jesus turns the table on his disciples, who are too busy guarding their own insider status rather than opening their hearts to all whom Jesus loves and seeks to liberate and lift up. Christians sometimes quarrel about who deserves the title Christian. For some, the proper response to the question, "ARE YOU A CHRISIAN?"

Jesus challenges us to embody his hospitality to all and become, as he is, the revelation of God's freeing and healing love to others. Like Christianity, every major world religion at its deepest teaches and challenges its followers to compassion.



# Living the Liturgy

St. Francis Pledge for Creation and the Poor

Remember years ago when talk about climate change was controversial, with scientists disagreeing with one another and the rest of us basically ignoring their discussion? Photos of glaciers melting and frighteningly accurate computer modeling as well as more scientific tests have awakened us and the rest of the world. In 2001, the Vatican representative to the United Nations Cardinal Renato Martino declared, "There is new and stronger evidence that most of the warming observed over the last 50 years is attributed to human activities and that coming changes will effect all aspects of the environment and societal well-being, especially for the poor, the vulnerable and the generations yet unborn." Our own bishops raised the issue at the same time when they proclaimed, "At its core, global climate change is not about economic theory or political platforms, nor about partisan advantage or interest group pressures. It is about the future of God's creation and the one human family." US Conference of Catholic Bishops, Global Climate Change: A Plea for Dialogue, Prudence and the Common Good.

Next weekend, you'll notice the banner with a red rose hanging by the choir. As Catholics, we commit ourselves to respect God's gift of life from conception until natural death for the poor, the vulnerable and the generations yet unborn. The readings we've been hearing these past weeks challenge us to put our faith into action even if others criticize us.

This October, we will expand our concern for the unborn to those of future generations in countries we've probably never visited. Since St. Francis is the co-patron of our archdiocese, his feast will be celebrated with distinct readings (which won't be in your missalette) at all the Masses next weekend. We will be invited to take the St. Francis Pledge for Creation and the Poor, giving us the opportunity to pray, learn, assess, act and advocate for this world which God has created and everyone who lives in it. Pope Benedict XVI urges us: "One of the fields in which it is urgent to work is most definitely that of safeguarding creation...Before it is too late, we must make courageous choices with a view to a strong alliance between humans and the earth... We need a decisive 'yes' to care for creation and a strong commitment to reverse those trends that risk making the situation of decay irreversible."

If you'd like to reflect on the readings used for the Feast of St. Francis, they are these: Sirach (Ecclesiasticus) 3.17-24; Psalm 16; Galatians 6.14-

18: and Matthew 11.25-30.

In today's gospel, Jesus praises those who give a cup of water to one of his disciples. How much more will he rejoice over us if we can help save Mother Earth from the devastation of climate change! Peace, Sheral P.S. Just a reminder that our parish Respect Life group meets tomorrow at 7pm in Mary's Chapel. Everyone is welcome.
