

#### Dear Parishioners;

The year 2009 has been one of great loss for our Parish with the death in August of our pastor, Father Bruce Dreier and then this past week of our faithful parish minister, Gene May. Both were dedicated to God and the call of Christ "to serve one another." The Vatican Council stated: "In the Church, there is diversity of service but unity of purpose. Christ conferred on the apostles and their successors the duty of teaching, sanctifying, and ruling in His Name and power. But the laity, too, share in the priestly, prophetic and royal office of Christ and therefore have their own role to play in the mission of the whole People of God in the Church and in the world." Father Bruce and Gene May demonstrated in their ministry to our Parish that on the day of their baptism each had been called to serve. Fr. Bruce did this as a priest and Gene as a husband, a father and as a minister within the Parish. Together, they made a great team. May God give them eternal rest.

With the deaths of Fr. Bruce and Gene, we all should give some extra thought to our relationship with Christ and His Church and how we might better serve the community. The following prayer might help,



#### **All Souls Day**



#### **Encouragement to Conserve**

- -Climate change is affecting crop production. In rural Peru, farmers report that irregular rains and intense heat have wiped out half their production of staple crops like corn and potatoes. A government study found nearly 350,000 acres of crops have been lost due to climate change. (Oxfam)
- -There are now 26 million refugees and displaced people due to climate change. (Oxfam)
- -The WHO estimates climate change causes 150,000 deaths per year in developing countries. (World Health Organization) Clearly, the best thing we can do to help the poor is not to ignore climate change, but to confront it head-on while making sure low-income people can cope with its effects and rising energy prices.

### Living the Liturgy

"I Want to See"

Last Sunday's first reading was from Good Friday; today's first reading sounds like Gaudete Sunday in Advent! The image is that of God bringing back the exiles, including the weak: the blind and lame, the mothers and pregnant women. God consoles them and leads them home on an easy, level path with the water so vital in the desert. The reading was chosen to match the gospel story of Bartimaeus, a blind man.

The crowd tries to shush this poor beggar, obviously a sinner to the people of his time since he is afflicted with blindness. But he cries out all the more loudly! Jesus asks him, "What do you want me to do for you?" "Master, I want to see," he replies. Jesus heals him. Bartimaeus is a great example for the rest of us, refusing to be swayed by the discouragement of the crowd. His faith that this itinerant preacher can heal him is unshakeable.

How about us? Do we ask the Lord for whatever we specifically need? Can we be persistent when no response seems forthcoming? Bartimaeus' desire to see could be echoed by most of us. Do we need to see our children differently when their choices may disappoint us? Do we need to see ourselves differently when we do the same foolish thing over and over again? Do we need to see our world differently if all we can do is focus on the negative happenings? Do we need to see our God differently if we are stuck in old ideas and old images which block our response to God's constant love for each of us?

The reading from Hebrews speaks of Jesus as a high priest, offering himself to the Father on our behalf. The Archdiocesan Vocations Office has asked us to pray especially for priests and for priestly vocations this Sunday and throughout this Year for Priests. Why not send a note to a priest who has been significant in your life? If he is deceased, thank God for his life and ministry. If you know someone whom you feel would be a great priest, why not tell him so? We will receive from God the leaders we pray for!
