

Second Collection For Annual Appeal Next Weekend November 14-15

There will be a second collection to assist the parish in covering our assessment to the Archbishop's Annual Appeal. Our assessment must be paid whether or not we reach the goal of our Annual Appeal goal. For the 2008 Annual Appeal we fell almost \$10,000 short of our goal. The parish had to make up this difference from parish funds.

The parish finance committee reviewed the statistics of the campaign. One critical factor was the number of families who participated by making a pledge or a one time gift. Last year only 360 families out of 2221 registered families. This equates to approximately 16% who participated in the Archbishop's Appeal.

The parish finance council passed a resolution to institute a quarterly second collection to give the opportunity for more families to participate in the Archbishop's Appeal. This year our assessment is \$98,400. To date we have received pledges and gifts in the amount of \$90,297.32 from 500 families. Please help us to make our assessment this year.


AIDS LUNCH –November 11th

Living the Liturgy

Of Widows and Generosity

In the first reading, the prophet Elijah asks a destitute widow for bread and water, insisting that she feed him before her son and herself. Because of her generosity, he promises her that she will have enough until the rains come and the drought is over. And so it happens. In the gospel, Jesus excoriates those who "devour the houses of widows." We can imagine his anger at those who sold subprime mortgages to people whom they knew could never afford them and to the Ponzi schemers who have literally bankrupted people of their life savings. We might wonder if those who "put in large sums" to the treasury were contributing ill-gotten gain. Jesus' holds up as an example the widow who out of the very little she has, gives everything.

If you've ever been to a poor country or to the poorer parts of this country, you may have experienced the same generosity. When I worked at Mission Dolores, I was constantly impressed by the homeless men who would only take one pair of socks and one pair of underwear, knowing that there were many others who would need socks and underwear as well.

Our country and our state are in a strange way. Our parish, unlike many in the archdiocese, has not experienced a drastic drop in the collection. Thank you. Your generosity in this difficult time gives continued evidence of your commitment and your trust in God.

Many of the people whose names surround us as we pray in church were simple people of profound faith. Most of us older adults grew up with parents who worked hard, prayed a lot, watched every penny, and taught us to be careful with our money. The opportunity for us to help our children and grandchildren to learn the same lessons has been thrust upon us. Is this the year when we decide not to give Christmas presents except to the children in our families? Might we give the practical gifts they need instead of the unnecessary gadgets which they want? Could we give the gift of time to the adults whom we love? A walk in the park? A meal prepared together? An offer of babysitting? May the Spirit help us discover creative ways of expressing our love which don't cost a lot of money! *Peace, S. Sheral*

USCCB NATIONWIDE Tell Congress: Remove Abortion Funding & Mandates from Needed Health Care Reform

Congress is preparing to debate health care reform legislation on the House and Senate floors. Genuine health care reform should protect the life and dignity of all people from the moment of conception until natural death. The U.S. bishops' conference has concluded that all committee-approved bills are seriously deficient on the issues of abortion and conscience and do not provide adequate access to health care for immigrants and the poor. The bill will have to change or the bishops have pledged to oppose them.

Our nation is at a crossroads. Policies adopted in health care reform will have an impact for good or ill for years to come. None of the bills retains longstanding current policies against abortion funding or abortion coverage mandates, and none fully protects conscience rights in health care.

As the U.S. bishops' letter of October 8 states: "No one should be required to pay for or participate in abortion. It is essential that the legislation clearly apply to this new program longstanding and widely supported federal restrictions on abortion funding and mandates, and protections for rights of conscience. No current bill meets this test...If acceptable language in these areas cannot be found, we will have to oppose the health care bill vigorously."

Congressional leaders are attempting to put together final bills for floor consideration.
