Dear Parishioners,

One of the great blessings of my life has been a love of reading. Books have been a source of knowledge, a source of enjoyment and, to be honest, all too often a way to escape from difficulties of everyday life. Often, as I read, I wish I could share the wisdom of what is set before me. Recently, I went back to read Pope John XXIII's JOURNAL OF A SOUL, the spiritual diary that he kept during his long life. For all of us, young or old, he gives us so much to meditate upon.

As he approached 70 years of age, Pope John wrote: I must not disguise from myself the truth: I am definitely approaching old age. My mind resents this and almost rebels, for I still feel so young, eager, agile and alert. But one look in my mirror disillusions me. This is the season of maturity; I must do more and better, reflecting that perhaps the time still granted to me for living is brief, and I am drawing near to the gates of eternity ... No, I do not weep, and I do not even desire to live my life over again, so as to do better. I entrust to the Lord's mercy whatever I have done, badly or less than well, and I look to the future, brief or long as it may be here below, because I want to make it holy and a source of holiness to others.

As we journey through the season of Advent, it is a good time for us to think about our own commitment to Christ. Do we thank Him for being born into our world? Do we thank Him for coming to us in the Eucharist? Do we thank Him for being present in others? Are we prepared to join Him at the time of our death? Advent can be a time for us to grow in holiness so that others can see Christ in us.

May Christ, the Son of God, be with you.



WEEKLY READINGS

ST. ROBERTS SCHOOL

In November, Saint Robert School completed a successful WCEA / WASC visit for accreditation. One of the greatest strengths noted in the report was the strong parish and school connection. The visiting team commented on the seamless support of parishioners for the school and school families to the parish. I would like to thank everyone for your continued support in creating a quality education for the students of Saint Robert School.

Last week, the biannual publication "Across the Parish" was mailed to all parishioners. One of the articles published the Financial Report and Budget of Saint Robert School. While the figure of a \$100,000 deficit is accurate for the 2008-2009 School year, I felt an explanation of the amount would alleviate fears regarding the financial stability of the school. First, the school completed a renovation of the boys and girls restrooms on the main floor of the school. While Centerplate funds were utilized for a portion of the project, money placed in reserves during the three previous year's budgets completed the funding. This money is not included in the revenues for the 2008-2009 school year since it was collected in previous years but the expenditure for the project is in the expense portion of facilities. The final cost to renovate the restrooms was approximately \$175,000. The balance of the deficit was a result of the decrease in the stock market, which affected our balance in the Investment Pool with the Archdiocese. With the upturn in the stock market since June, the school has already been able to recoup some of its losses.

I hope this clears up any confusion or concern regarding the fiscal stability of Saint Robert School. *God bless,*

History Of "Simbang Gabi" (Advent Novena of Masses)

It was in or about 1660, during the early years of Christianity in the Philippines, that the "Simbang Gabi" or the "Misa de Gallo" became a Filipino religious tradition. During Advent, in preparation for the coming of Jesus at Christmas, the missionary friars held nine days of Masses to usher in the event of Christ's birth. These Masses were celebrated in the early morning hours, typically at about 4:00 AM when the roosters crow to announce the coming of a new day. *There was a practical reason* behind the missionary father's design to hold early Mass. The Filipinos are a farming people, and they typically greeted the dawn of a new day in the fields while working the land. The missionary fathers decided that they could implant in the hearts and minds of the theretofore heathen people the substance of the Catholic religion, preserve the Catholic faith and continue the propagation of the gospels by integrating a distinctly Filipino custom with the needs of Catholic worship.

The word "gallo" comes from the Spanish word meaning rooster. At first sound of dawn, at the crowing of the rooster, the entire family would get up and walk (or ride their carabao sleds) to their nearest parish church - sometimes up to 10 kilometers away. By 5:00 AM, the Mass was over and the men were off to the fields.

It was thus that *Simbang Gabi* (*"Simba"* means Mass, and *"Gabi"* means night or evening) or *Misa de Gallo* became a Filipino tradition. It was a religious practice that was handed down from parent to child, observed by Filipinos from one generation to the next.

The agricultural roots of "*Misa de Gallo*" or "*Simbang Gabi*" are all but forgotten now. However, the fascination of going to church at dawn, in order to start the new day with worship, is as strong as ever among Filipinos. For the children, it announces that Christmas is just around the corner. For most, the practice has acquired its own smell and flavor, and spiritual significance distinct from any other time of the year.

Vatican Council II, Article 37 of the Sacred Liturgy states: "Even in the Liturgy, the church does not wish to impose a rigid uniformity in matters which do not involve the faith or the good of the whole community. Rather she respects and fosters the qualities and talents of various races and nations. People's way of life which is not indissolubly bound with superstition and error she studies with sympathy, and if possible, preserves intact. She sometimes even admits such things into the liturgy itself, provided they harmonize with its true and authentic spirit."

In keeping with the spirit of the document on Sacred Liturgy (Art.37), the Holy See has granted special permission to the Philippine Church to celebrate the Simbang Gabi for nine consecutive days before Christmas. The Holy See is cognizant of the particulars of the Simbang Gabi celebration. She knows that to add to the festivities, a local band goes around town playing Christmas songs and inviting people to worship. After the Mass, the band continues to play and a variety of delicacies are displayed in the churchyard for everyone's pleasure. On the sidewalk, lighted lanterns called *"Parols"* (Filipino version of the star of David) add to the joyous atmosphere that pervades the air.

The Filipino immigrants brought this tradition with them when they came to the United States. Since it is not practical to hold a celebration at dawn, the cold December weather will not allow it, local parishes hold the celebration at night. While the form of the celebration is changed, the substance remains.

Here at St. Robert's we will celebrate Simbang Gabi Masses from December 15th—23rd.

CLIVING THE LITURGY Be Joyful Sunday

This weekend we light the pink candle and the readings are constantly telling us to rejoice! Zephaniah declares that "The Lord your God is in your midst; a mighty savior; he will rejoice over you with gladness." Imagine – God rejoicing over each one of us, with our faults and failings, our goodness and generosity. Pretty inspiring, yes? I can imagine God "sing[ing] joyfully because of you" with the outpouring of loving concern you continually give through the food drive, the two Giving Trees, the One Warm Coat drive, the baskets for the homebound and your ongoing contributions of time, talent and treasure to the parish. You are a most amazing community! Thank you from the bottom of our hearts and from all those who will be the recipients of your care and concern.

I had an experience last week which has given me pause. A parishioner told me he was not able to follow through on a commitment he had made. I was mentally judging him irresponsible and, fortunately, mentioned that to friends of his. Little did I know that his Dad had been in a major accident and that the reason for his "irresponsibility" was the need to support his family with an additional weekend job. What a good reminder to have mercy on each other, to give the person the benefit of the doubt, especially during this hectic time! May we have mercy on ourselves, too, and trust that those we love value our presence more than any present we might give. **Peace, S. Sheral**
