Dear Parishioners,

"Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets."

These words we read in today's Gospel. (Luke 5:1-11).

How often these words of Saint Peter are like echoes of our prayer to our heavenly Father. We work so hard and see very little results. Peter was the professional fisherman and as far as he and his friends knew, Jesus knew very little about fishing and lakewater and boats. Yet, Peter did as Jesus told him and because he did the will of God, he was rewarded with a tremendous catch of fish - much to his surprise and that of the other disciples. They only lowered the nets to please Jesus.

As we prepare for Lent 2010 let's take this Gospel passage as our inspiration and encouragement. The apostles were weary, tired, frustrated and perhaps hungry, having worked hard all night. Their physical condition was not the ideal for taking on another task – "but at your command, I will." Peter said.

As Lent begins Christians are so often weary, depressed and filled with negative feelings after the long cold, wet winter. They feel that there is not much more they can volunteer for or handle right now. Yet it was when the disciples were feeling just as we may be that they had the greatest success.

"Do not be afraid..." Jesus told his disciples and he also is telling us today. The vineyard of the Lord is so great and the laborers are so few. Perhaps, this Lent you might follow Saint Peter's example and take on some volunteer work at Saint Robert's and hopefully with the same overwhelming results.

God bless you with a grace-filled and a peaceful Lent.



Living the Liturgy

God's Interruption

All three of today's readings relate a call from God - an experience of God or Jesus interrupting the everydayness of a person's life. Isaiah was praying in the temple; Paul was simply walking on the road; Peter was in his boat, after a fruitless night of fishing. Each one's response is first a sense of his own sinfulness and then, a life-changing response.

For each of us, too, God's call may come while we're in the midst of our ordinary lives. Jude Siciliano, OP has a suggestion: *Practice attentiveness to what we experience and hear each day. For example, do we have a wise friend who speaks the truth we need to hear? Do we take the Scriptures we hear each Sunday and try to apply them to our lives? When we complete a task or chore, can we pause, take a breath and ask, "What next, Lord?" And listen for a response? Can we begin each day with a resolution to try to find Christ and listen to him while we work or study? ("First Impressions," Jan. 29)*

With Ash Wednesday 10 days away, it's not too early to begin to listen attentively to whatever the Lord might want to say to us during Lent. **Peace, S. Sheral**
