Dear Parishioners.

If you heard the readings of Ash Wednesday – the same exact readings as for every Ash Wednesday, you might want to take some time this week to read them prayerfully yourself at home. The prophet Joel commands us, "Rend your hearts, not your garments and return to the Lord your God." This is similar to what we heard when we were blest with ashes. "Turn away from sin and believe the gospel." The most important fact to remember as we enter into this holy season of Lent is that it is God who calls us to repentance and waits and hopes for our response!

If we could change our hearts and our lives on our own, we would have done it by now, right?

But the readings, the songs, the purple color of penitence all invite us to let the Spirit change us this Lent. We're different from last Lent. Hopefully, we've grown spiritually and emotionally and in our concern for others. Some of us have lost loved ones; some of us have been blessed with new babies in our families or watched our children go off to kindergarten or grad school.

Lots of life has happened since last Lent.

Paul's letter to the Corinthians admonishes us, "Be reconciled to God." How long has it been since I seriously spent time praying? How long since I received the sacrament of reconciliation? How long since I made an effort to reach across a divide of resentment or anger with a co-worker or family member? How long since I've prayed for someone I really don't like? If I've been putting off getting my marriage blest or my children baptized or making my own First Communion and Confirmation, might now be the time? Do we find ourselves saying to each other, "You know, we really ought to start going back to Mass every Sunday"? I once met a woman who felt that since she hadn't been to Mass in years, she could not come back and would no longer be welcome in the parish. I assured her that nothing could make a parish staff member happier than for someone to return to the practice of the faith. In that same letter, Paul reminds us "Now is a very acceptable time; behold, now is the day of salvation." So what should you be doing or not doing this Lent? Take a few moments of quiet and ask for the Spirit's guidance. I need to ask myself that same question. What will help me to open my heart and mind to the action of God's Spirit? The regulation of fasting and abstaining is meant to remind us physically of our hunger for God and of our solidarity with all God's starving people. What else would help me to become closer to God, to my family, to my community, to my sisters and brothers? If you set aside whatever money you save from your Lenten practice, you can put it in the envelopes in the pews periodically or at the end of Lent. It will go to Fr. Nnanna's efforts to build another church in his vast parish in Nigeria. Thank you in advance!

Living the Liturgy

Welcome to Lent!

I don't know if you recall that the very word "lent" comes from an Old English word meaning "springtime." It's helpful as we reflect on what our personal practices might be to recall that springtime is a season of growth, of blossoming. That's what our lilac tree in front of the altar will symbolize, hopefully, as the days and weeks of Lent continue. If our hearts are open, the Spirit can do the work of changing us, then growth will come and the world will be more beautiful because of our presence in it!

Prayer, fasting and almsgiving – perhaps, you can choose one action related to each of these traditional practices. Come to daily Mass if you can or spend a few minutes reading the gospel for each day the citation for which appears in the bulletin. Fast from whatever your most annoying habit might be! Skip a daily stop at Starbucks and give those six weeks of savings to Fr. Nnanna's church building fund. Forego a new item of clothing to purchase underwear for the homeless at San Bruno Catholic Worker. And as you do whatever you do, pray for someone who needs a sense of God's presence: the people of Haiti, the Palestinians, the Afghans and Iraqis caught between warring factions. May the Spirit guide those in authority to make decisions leading to justice and peace. Have a fruitful Lent! *S. Sheral*
