LIVING THE LITURGY

Let the Oppressed Go Free

In one of the readings we heard the first week of Lent, Isaiah proclaims, "Is not this the sort of fast that pleases me - it is the Lord who speaks - to break unjust fetters and undo the thongs of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free." Seven human rights groups, including Churches for Middle East Peace of which Maryknoll Missioners and Franciscan Friars are members, have written a letter to President Obama urging him to make every effort to persuade the Israeli government to open the closures to Gaza. Since the incursion of the Israeli Defense Force into Gaza in January of 2009, the 1.4 million residents have borne terrible suffering. 70% of the people survive on \$1 a day; 40% of the workers are unemployed. Before the incursion, 850 trucks daily brought food, goods and fuel from Israel; today 128 trucks enter Gaza. 11% of Gazan children are malnourished to the point of stunting due to poverty and inadequate food. Infant mortality is on the rise. 20,000 homes have been destroyed or damaged, as well as 281 schools. Water and sewage facilities are in disrepair, creating major health and environmental hazards; 15 out of 27 hospitals were bombed and 43 of 110 clinics. Patients face long delays to visit Israeli hospitals and 28 persons have died while waiting.

Bishop Howard J. Hubbard of Albany, New York and Chairman of the Committee on International Justice and Peace for the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, returned from a weeklong visit deeply concerned. He said, "This trip was a reality check because that area is a tinderbox waiting to erupt, and if it does, there will no winners, only losers...There is a great sense of urgency in 2010 that all parties must come together with the assistance of the international community, the leadership of the United States and the cooperation of the Arab states. That is the only way a solution acceptable to all parties can be negotiated." If you'd like to read the letter and sign on to it, please go to www.cmep.org. Thank you.

Change Builds Churches

We've promised Fr. Nnanna that we'd help him to build an addition to his parish church in Nigeria. 2000 people come from as far as 6 miles away. It will cost \$60,000, so any contribution we can make towards that will be most helpful! Please take an envelope from the hymnal rack and put in whatever you save from your sacrificial practice during Lent. You can turn it in during Holy Week or each week or so, whichever works better for you. If you want to make out a check, please make it out to the parish. Thank you.
