

Dear Parishioners,

Lent calls us to prune, cultivate, and fertilize our lives-all in hope of bearing fruit.

• What has changed us most in our lives? What do we need to cultivate in our lives or relationships?

Jesus stands with sinners at his baptism and explains to the scribes and Pharisees who criticize him for eating and drinking with the tax collectors. "I have not come to invite the self-righteous to a change of heart but sinners." Jesus sees finding one lost sheep or one lost coin as reason to celebrate. At the beginning of Sunday's gospel Jesus refutes the common belief of his time, that tragedies are punishment for sin. In this theology, God rewards good people with prosperity and punishes evil with tragedy and poverty. Asking why bad things happen to good people is a question that arises out of the same reward and punishment theology. The sight a bush burning intrigues Moses and draws him closer, yet he hides his face. As Moses meets and speaks with God, he experiences both fascination and fear. The bush, burning yet not consumed, preserves a paradox as an image of the holy. Fire suggests power and passion. What heats us up connects with our deepest passions and commitments. Fire destroys and renews. Unexpected deaths can awaken us to the fragility of our lives and lead us to conversion. Unexpected rescues such as the plane Captain Sullenberger landed in the Hudson River can also make us examine our own purposes. Those who bear horrific memories such as those of the Holocaust call us all to resist evil in our culture and ourselves. As we journey with Jesus to Jerusalem in Lent, the gospel calls us to cultivate our capacity to love and care for one another.

LIVING THE LITURGY

The Halfway Point

Our parish is blest to have four adults preparing to become Catholic, that is, to receive the sacraments of initiation, and three who will be completing their initiation by receiving First Communion and/or Confirmation. Today and the next two weekends they will be experiencing the scrutinies, a word that basically means "getting rid of the garbage." Lent for them is preparation for the sacraments, a sort of "housecleaning."

For the rest of us, Lent means preparation for the re-commitment we'll make at Easter by renewing our baptismal promises. But we probably could use some housecleaning, too! Luke's gospel today is a strong call to repentance, to conversion of heart. It's easy to choose something simple to "do" or "give up" for Lent, but how much better if we choose some aspect of our lives which REALLY does need changing. What might that be? Each of us is the only one who knows what that is. Now that we're halfway through "this holy season of Lent," do we have the courage with the Spirit's help to do or forego that difficult thing? If we tend to take what we have for granted, we might think of the Haitians as we leave food on our plates or complain about waiting in line. If our world is too small, we might check the labels when we do our wash and pray for the persons who made those items. If we're holding a grudge, we might commit ourselves to praying for that person daily - for his or her conversion and our own! Those of us at the 5 pm (including the RCIA folks) heard the familiar gospel of the Samaritan woman from the fourth chapter of John's gospel. Jesus isn't supposed to talk to her on two accounts: she's a woman (unaccompanied by a male relative) and she's a Samaritan (looked down upon by the Jewish people). If you read the passage slowly at home, you'll notice a real progression in the way the woman addresses Jesus. His words find a home in her heart and she changes from skepticism to belief. Then she becomes an "apostle," one who goes out to preach the Word in the person of Jesus to her townspeople. Is there someone in your circle of friends or family who could welcome the news that God loves her or him, regardless of what sins or mistakes lie in the past?
