

Dear Friends:

Each year I try to make some time for personal reflection on how I'm living my life. Time to remember that *all things happen for a reason*, and most importantly, that *things happen in GOD'S TIME – not mine*. (I really need to work on that.) Allowing time to reflect on our life and our actions, gives us an opportunity to see if we have truly made an effort to live as Jesus did.

During Lent, certain readings spark a fire in my heart. Today's Gospel is one of those readings. I try to imagine the scene and place myself in it. I am part of a judgmental crowd, I see a woman scorned and embarrassed, members of the crowd are dragging her to be judged, and Jesus in his calm mannerisms addresses the crowd's questions:



Jesus bent down and began to write on the ground with his finger. But when they continued asking him, Jesus straightened up and said to them, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." Again he bent down and wrote on the

My favorite retreat experience had us reflect on this reading. We were asked to consider – **WHAT WAS JESUS WRITING IN THE SAND?** Perhaps he had written all the wrongs of the bystanders, each walking away as they noticed their transgression. Perhaps he wrote words like Kindness, Compassion, Forgiveness – reminding the bystanders to see with different eyes. What do you think Jesus wrote? If we were among the bystanders – what would Jesus write that spoke to us? How often do we judge others without looking at our own lives?

Here's my challenge for you this week –
Make a conscious effort to AVOID gossip.
Encourage someone who the crowd is scorning.
Share a kind word or smile with a stranger.
Remember the compassion Jesus showed the
woman with just a few simple words --

" Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you? Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin any more."




