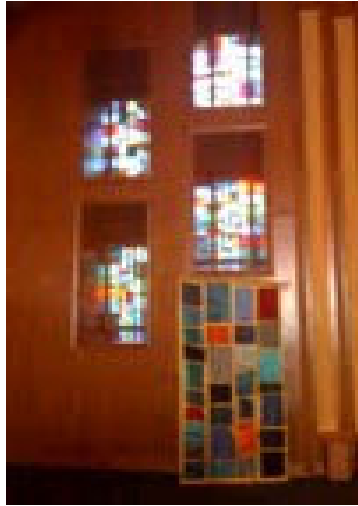

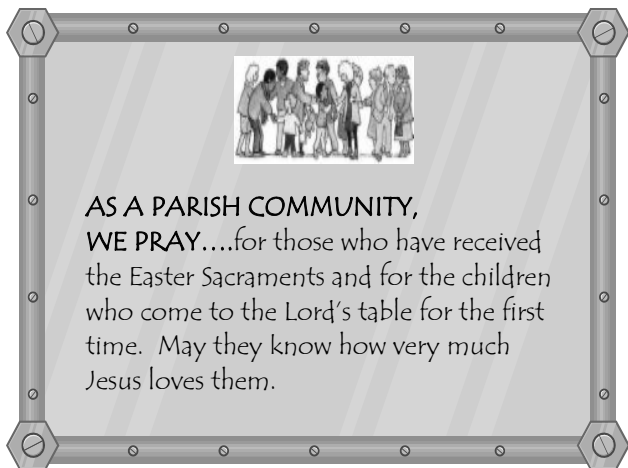

Living the Liturgy

In Jesus' Hands

I've been in Denver for meetings with the leadership of the three provinces (regions) of our Franciscan community. The 88 year old priest who celebrated Mass with us last Sunday was so excited about it being the Easter season! (I hope that I will be as excited about my vocation after so many years of living it!) The disciples were crushed that the one in whom they had placed all their hopes had been crucified like a common criminal. So they went back to what they knew before he came into their lives: fishing. Jesus shows up where they are - in the midst of their everyday livelihood. Fr. Harry stressed that the Risen Jesus was with them, not rebuking them for having denied him or having deserted him. He eats with them again as he had so many times before, and as he had done at his last supper with them. He is different, we know, since they didn't recognize him, but he loves them as much as ever!

His questioning Peter three times may have seemed strange to us. It makes more sense when we look at the Greek words John's community employs in conveying this interchange. The word Jesus uses the first two times when he says "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" is the Greek word *agape*; in other words, "Do you love me with a selfless, sacrificial love?" Peter responds, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you," using the Greek word *filia*, the word for the love of friendship. The third time Jesus poses the question, he asks, "Simon, son of John, do you *filia* me?" I think this is a wonderful example of Jesus taking people where they are! If, at this point, Peter is only capable of the love of friendship, that's good enough for Jesus. Peter does grow into the *agape* kind of love which he has consistently experienced from Jesus and which we heard about in the passage from the Acts of the Apostles.

This weekend, we hear a brief, but moving piece of John's gospel: Jesus' response to the Jewish authorities. We're the sheep, of course, we hear his voice, he knows us, and we follow him. "I give them (us) eternal life." - in the present, not in the future. And we are held in his hand and the Father's hand. No matter what troubles affect the Church, our country, our family or individual lives, God is holding on to us. Hopefully, we also experience being held by those in our community who love us and whom we love. Why not take a few moments this week to sit quietly with these words, hands open on your lap: "I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish. No one can take them out of my hand. My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all, and no one can take them out of the Father's hand. The Father and I are one."
