Dear Parishioners,

An article in America magazine entitled "A Life Freely Given" describes Sister of Charity and Doctor Mary Revelt. Despite precautions, a needle stick from a patient who was an IV drug user, infected her with hepatitis. Dr. Reyelt lived 14 years with a liver transplant, continued to serve the poor people living with HIV, and took pride in helping women with HIV give birth to healthy babies. Her life was not taken from her because of a needle stick. She gave it fully and freely because of her commitment to Jesus and to the poor and the sick He inspired her to love Jesus' command to wash one another's feet parallels his command to love one another, that passage that forms Sunday's Gospel. To love one another as Jesus does is to love to the end, all the way, with the one loved unto death.

This Sunday, Jesus speaks knowing He comes from God and will return to God. The Gospel deliberately places Jesus' command to love one another as He loved us between his prophecy. Friendship more adequately describes our relationship with Jesus than does the relationship of sheep to their shepherd. Jesus calls us to be a community of friends and stand with one another to the end.

Jesus' simple command to love one another takes a lifetime to transform us as we live it out. Let us make a commitment to serve our friends our family members and co-workers in need. Let us build the city of God and pledge to sustain one another in our Joys and Sorrows.

It is with sadness that I accepted the resignation of Kathy Hanley, our Office Administrator for the past twelve years. However, I fully respect



LIVING THE LITURGY

The Most Difficult Commandment

Remember decades ago when the fear of God motivation for many of our religious practices was being replaced by a focus on the love of God? We heard homilies (no longer sermons) on how much God loves us and how our moral decisions should be a response of love, not fear. I remember some people saying that this meant that there were no more rules or regulations, that anyone could do anything he or she wanted to. It took us a while, granted, to realize that this new way called for an adult faith and an adult response to situations which weren't simple and weren't covered in the catechism we learned as children.

In today's gospel, we hear the most challenging words of Jesus: "As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." I daresay most of us didn't find it terribly difficult to avoid murdering someone! But aren't there some people we find very difficult to love? The co-worker who considers himself an expert on everything? The relative who ignores us at gatherings? The neighbor whose guests always leave loudly at midnight? Yet these are the people Jesus commands us to love, not the ones we naturally feel attracted to. We can't do it on our own which is why he can say they'll know we're his disciples if we love one another: there's no way we can love those we find hard to love except through his grace and strength! If someone is rude to me, my automatic reaction is to be equally rude, if not more so. It's only the gentle power of the Spirit which can stop me, have me think about my response, and then let me choose to be loving even when part of me doesn't want to be. Love really is a decision, not a feeling, as our culture seems to promote. So try it this week! Ask for the guidance of the Holy Spirit and see if you can be that Easter presence of Christ, loving no matter what. I'm going to try, too. Peace, S. Sheral


