Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday's gospel passage from Luke is truly good news. Anyone who is lost will be found. The good Lord will not stop until he finds the lost soul because every soul is precious and dear to God. Every soul is worth the time and effort to be found. Jesus will not rest until the lost soul is brought home. Day and night the Lord will go out to the byways and highways to find those who have lost their way.

What we consider insignificant God finds significant. One sheep out of a hundred, one coin out of ten, and one son out of two is not too small for God. When we loose something from our abundant supply, we dismiss it. We cut our losses and move on. We tell ourselves it is not worth the time and effort to search for it. It may cost more than what it is worth to look for it. That is human thinking. God, though, does not think that way.


The righteous Pharisees and scribes do not believe tax collectors and sinners are worth saving. It is easy to condemn people for making poor decisions and choices in life. Sometimes people get themselves into trouble. Sometimes they cause their own demise. After awhile they soon lose their way in life. We give up on them consequently. We lose hope. God though does not give up on those who have abandoned him. He does not lose hope. God goes after anyone and everyone who has gone down the wrong road. When a soul is lost it is as if a part of God is missing. When we lose a loved one, a part of us dies.

When God finds the lost soul, there is much celebration to be had. Finding the lost soul is like finding the very best thing of God. What we consider the very worse of us, God considers the very best of us. Sometimes the very best of us lose our way in life. Every human being matters to God. God is complete when the lost soul is brought home. A house is not a home until both the righteous and the sinner are sitting together at the table of the Lord sharing a meal.

LIVING THE LITURGY

Calculating the Cost

The readings today are challenging. The Book of Wisdom from the Hebrew scriptures asks: "Who can know God's counsel, or who can conceive what the Lord intends?" We who live in this age, after Jesus' time on earth are blest with the example of Jesus. In the gospel, he warns the "great crowds" following him that they must give discipleship precedence over even their family concerns and must "carry [their] own cross." Those of us baptized as infants didn't choose to be Catholic, but we do have the opportunity to affirm our parents' choice by consciously letting our being his disciples influence the small choices of daily life and the big ones as well. People who come into the church through the RCIA process are told to consider carefully what changes they'll need to make to be committed followers of Jesus. Throughout the liturgical year, we hear of his reaching out to "the other" – the lepers, the Samaritans, the tax collectors, the public sinners, the woman considered unclean. His example calls us to some uncomfortable attitudes and actions.

For example, you may have heard that the Dove World Church of Gainesville, Florida is inviting people to "Burn the Quran" on Sept. 11. "Islam and Sharia law was responsible for 9/11," Pastor Terry Jones said. "We will burn Qurans because we think it's time for Christians, for churches, for politicians to stand up and say no; Islam and Sharia law is not welcome in the US." But Islam is no more responsible for the tragedy of 9/11 than Christianity is responsible for the hangings by the Ku Klux Klan! The Islamic cultural center which includes a mosque, but also a conference hall, culinary school, basketball court, and swimming pool - will be open to the wider community of New York City. Its name, Cordoba House, alludes to Muslim Spain I which Islam flourished alongside Christianity and Judaism from the 8th century till the 15th. It is 2 to 5 blocks from Ground Zero (depending on which article you read) and won't even be seen from there. Members of the Muslim community who have been peacefully present in Murfreesboro, Tennessee for 30 years have recently experienced gunshots on the building site of their mosque and the vandalizing of its construction vehicles. Members of Grace Baptist Church and many of the townspeoexpressed their disgust at such intolerance and are ple have publicly supporting their neighbors who are Muslim.

Forgotten in the sometimes violent discourse is the fact that many Muslims were killed in the World Trade Center and that the Muslim imams here condemned the terrorists of 9/11 and declared that they were not in any way following Islam. If we are Jesus' followers, where does our faith in him place us in this controversy? As we approach 9/11, perhaps we can pray for all who died that day, for their families, and for an end to the hatred which fuels such actions. **Peace, S. Sheral**
