## Living Liturgy

The Resurrection

As we approach the end of the liturgical year, the readings focus on the end of the world, the end of our own lives and the resurrection. Today's first reading was chosen because of its affirmation of life after death, something which our Jewish ancestors only realized gradually, about 150 years before the birth of Jesus. The second reading conveys Paul's encouragement to the Thessalonians who had thought Jesus' second coming would be during their lifetimes. They need to shift their mindset and their practices to include faithfulness to his message for the long haul. The gospel demonstrates how Jesus eludes the trap set by the Sadducees. He points out that once we're resurrected, earthly arrangements like marriage will no longer be in effect. The wife previously "owned" by her husband will then be equally a "child of God."

"They are like angels" refers to our being heavenly messengers. In Luke's gospel, angels appear "at the most critical moments" according to Barbara Reid, OP in America. Angels appear to Mary at the annunciation; Moses and Elijah appear as heavenly messengers at the transfiguration; and two angels are present in the empty tomb. Sr. Barbara points out, "It is the refusal already in this life to allow evil to triumph; it is not simply delayed reward in the beyond."

Surrounded in the church as we are by the names of those who've died in the past year, we are invited to reflect on our own lives. How does our belief in the resurrection affect our daily lives? Even with our own troubles and the many crises in our global family, does believing in the resurrection cause us to be messengers of hope? Let us pray for each other.
