Christmas is almost here. We light the last candle in our Advent Wreath. The Gospel starts with the words, "This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about". Now is the time to open our bibles and read to our children, grand children, families, friends, or just for ourselves the biblical story of the birth of Christ.

The birth of Jesus only appears in two Gospels. Luke chapter 1, verses 5-80 is where the Infancy Narrative begins. In chapter 2, verses 1-20 tell the story of the Birth of Jesus. And continuing in chapter 2, verses 21-52 tell of the Childhood of Jesus.

In Matthew's Gospel we have the birth of Jesus with the wise men beginning in chapter 1, verse 18, and continuing into chapter 2, verse 12. This is where this weekends Gospel is found. Continuing in chapter 2, verses 13-23 is the Childhood of Jesus.

Both Gospels were told from different points of view and told to different groups of believers yet they give us the opportunity to combine the stories to have a better image for ourselves of the birth of our savior.

Sr. Macrina Scott, O.S.F. writes, "As Christmas draws near, our hearts are filled with sacred pictures: the Virgin Mother dressed in blue, St. Joseph with white beard and brown cloak, the Wise Men in velvet and crowns leading camels, white-robed angels flying above the stable. We believe that our Creator has become one of us. This mystery is far beyond our understanding, yet we believe it and rejoice with all our hearts. We celebrate it. To allow it to be real to us, we need to picture it somehow."

Year of Renewal in Worship and Prayer

The Sign of the Cross & Greeting. People are not like television sets, able to change from one channel to another. Everyone needs actions that assist them from passing from one time to the next. The same is true when we gather to pray. The Introductory Rites, Sign of the Cross, Greeting and Introduction are ways that we

transition from being a people gathered to joining together as community, as the Body of Christ.

The Sign of the Cross is a traditional prelude to prayer. This is a self blessing that reminds us of our baptism when we were signed with the cross for the first time. As we gather, it reminds each of us that we are more than a worshipping community; we are first a baptismal community. The greeting and the introduction are more than the simple greetings that one may hear as they are walking down the street. The greeting "signifies the presence of the Lord to the community gathered there" (GIRM #50). It calls everyone to recognize and

"When the Entrance chant is concluded, the priest stands at the chair and, together with the whole gathering, makes the Sign of the Cross. Then he signifies the presence of the Lord to the community gathered there by means of the Greeting. experience the presence and power of the Lord in the community that they form through prayer. Finally, the introduction offers a very brief explanation of the special character of the celebration.

Question of the Week

How does your community help everyone to become united as "The Body of Christ" when we gather for liturgy? Joseph, our Example

The gospel on this last Sunday of Advent gives us an opportunity to learn a bit about Joseph and why he is often described as "the Just One." Put yourself in his place: the woman whom you love, whom you trust with your heart is found to be with child and you know that the child is not yours. Betrothal at that time was equal to marriage, so faithfulness is a definite expectation. You know Mary, you know that she honors the Jewish law as you do and would never break God's law or her commitment to you. You do believe her explanation, as strange as it seems.

So what do you do? According to the law, she is to be stoned for adultery or denounced publicly with the testimony of two witnesses. If you "divorce her quietly," she will be disgraced since the whole village will soon know why, as her pregnancy becomes obvious. If you marry her and adopt the child as your own, your reputation will be sullied. According to Barbara Reid, OP, "Only when [Joseph] can make her the center of his attention...can he make the divinely directed choice that will uphold her honor at the price of his own." Joseph is being like God in this situation, laying down his life for Mary "just as the Holy One rectifies the broken relationship with humanity by becoming one with us." (Reid)

Joseph is a great example of obedience—listening to his heart and his trust in Mary and listening to God's messenger who comes to him in a dream. This is the truest sense of obedience from the Latin words, *ab audire* which literally mean "to listen to." And how well do we listen to our compassionate God speaking through the events of our lives? The boundless energy of our children, the frailty of our elders, the beauty of our surroundings, the faithfulness of friends? Can we take 5 minutes in the shower or at the end of the day to ask ourselves, "Where has God been present to me today?"

The feast we celebrate at the end of this week is the Feast of Emmanuel, God- with-Us. God still believes in us and dwells among us in so many people and places. May we be open to that divine presence this week and always! Peace to you and yours.
