Dear Parishioners,

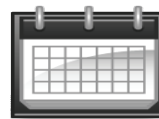

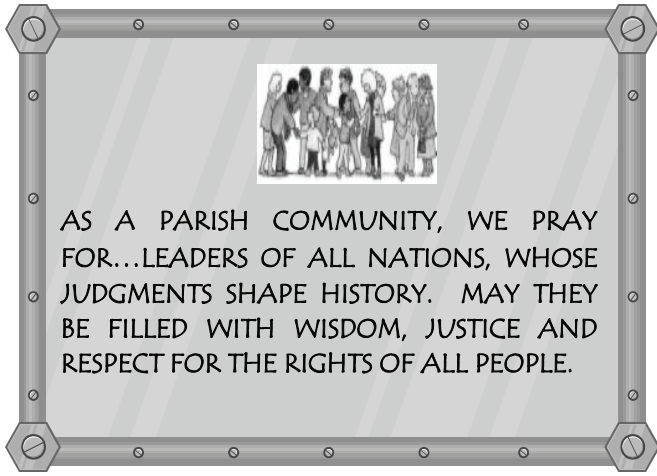

**Year of Renewal in Worship and Prayer
Liturgical Dialogues**

Quite a bit of attention is being given to the new "And with your spirit" response that we will pray when we begin celebrating Mass with the new edition of the Roman Missal. Let's take a step back from that particular response and look at the way our liturgy is "dialogic"

Think of all the conversations you have throughout the day. In many cases they are part of establishing or maintaining relationships . Dialogues within the Mass work in a similar way. The minister and the people engage in very short greetings or calls and responses to establish relationships within the liturgy.

Give it some thought. The next time the priest or deacon says, "The Lord be with you," before proclaiming the Gospel, or the priest sings or says, "Lift up your hearts," at the beginning of the Eucharistic Prayer, consider why we are engaging in these little dialogues at these specific moments of the Mass.

Question of the Week: *How do I carry my conversations with God in prayer into the Mass, and vice-versa?*
