I remember growing up that whenever my father came home from work; it was always a big deal for me and my siblings. Why? It's because my father never failed to bring us "pasalubong". "Pasalubong" could mean treats like candies or cookies, or it could mean presents like toys or clothing. We were always wondering what could be the next "pasalubong" that my father would bring the next time around. Most of the time we were confident that our father would not disappoint us. That's how much we trusted our father as a good provider. Of course, through the years our needs changed and it was not without struggle that my father tried his best to provide for us. But we would always cherish those days when we were young and our father had always something special for us whenever he came home from work.


This Sunday's gospel passage tells us about God's providence. In order to have a good understanding of what divine providence is, we have to look at it from the eyes of a child. A child has this basic trust in their parents. It is a natural instinct. Jesus has this same basic trust in his relationship with God, his Abba Father. That is why Jesus tells his disciples that if they want to enter the kingdom of heaven they should become like little children. Being childlike is not the same as being childish. And being childlike doesn't mean being exempted from all the worries that we normally encounter in our everyday living. We worry about how to provide food, clothing, shelter, education, transportation, etc. for our families. All of these may overwhelm us and we might be paralyzed by fear thinking about tomorrow's troubles.

However, if one is childlike and has this basic trust in God, that person is able to draw strength from God. A childlike person could cope with fear and the daily anxieties of life because of his wholehearted trust and confidence in God. That was how I felt as a child in my relationship with my father. As children we also had our share of anxious moments but our basic trust in our parents made them go away. Jesus tells us that we have a heavenly Father who knows what we need. When we seek first the kingdom of God like a child, God will provide us with what we need. And I say amen to that. Blessings, THE WEEK AHEAD

Living Liturgy

The Budget: A Moral Document?

You'll recall that during election time, the Church reminds us of our obligation as citizens to participate in our society especially by voting. During these weeks of budget negotiations, we might also be aware of what our faith says to the very practical problems which face us as a state and Proposals have been made to cut WIC as a nation. (women, infants, and children), the program assisting pregnant women and their small children to get proper nutrition. Child care assistance for people (mostly women) transitioning from welfare (now called TANF, Temporary Assistance for Needy Families) to work may also be cut. In-Home Supportive Services which enable developmentally and physically disabled and elderly people to stay in their homes is also on the chopping block. Education funding cuts, increasing the age for Social Security eligibility, cutting promised pension benefits - the list goes on and on. What does our faith say about such a challenging situation?

The Children's Defense Fund rates each state in terms of the health and wellness of its children. The findings may surprise us. California is 6^{th} among states in infant mortality and in babies born at low birthweight; 33^{rd} in per pupil school spending. 20% of our children live in poverty with almost 8 % living in extreme poverty. The maximum monthly TANF assistance for a family of 3 in California is \$723. (Can you imagine trying to support a family of three in *this* area on such a sum?) 23% of Medicaid expenditures are for children. A child or teen is killed by gunfire every 20 hours. Depressing as these statistics are, we need to keep them in mind as legislators speak, in abstractions, about cutting the deficit.


The gospel passage has Jesus telling the disciples three times not to worry. But he also says, "Seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given you besides." Surely, seeking the kingdom and trying to live by its values includes looking out for those in need. If we did that, each in our own way, and if our society cared for our "safety net," then the poor would not need to worry either. Sargent Shriver, a committed Catholic, director of the Peace Corps and involved in the Special Olympics, asked himself at the end of each day, "What have I done today to improve the lot of humanity?" A good question for us as individuals and as a society to ponder.

Coming after the proclamation of the Scriptures and the homily, it is the moment in which we begin to make a concrete response to the Word that has been spoken into our hearts.
