# THE WEEK AHEAD

Dear Parishioners,

In today's Gospel, three young men go up a mountain with Jesus whom they have grown to know as a friend. They return down the mountain, men called to believe what they think they saw. Jesus reveals Himself as more than friend. They see Him talking with whom Matthew places as Moses. а representative of the law, and Elijah who represents the tradition of the prophets. 

# From the desk of the Pastor

I am always touched by parishioners who always ask me if I am ok or if I'm having some respiratory problem. They notice that my speaking voice goes down whenever I say the mass. I know that they

are concerned about my health and well-being. As your pastor I believe it is necessary that I explain to you what my vocal disorder is. I have mentioned this several times in the past during mass. Of course, many parishioners are still not aware of this. And I doubt that every parishioner will really have a chance to know what my condition is.

Two years ago, I was diagnosed with Spasmodic Dysphonia. But I've had this vocal disorder since 1992. I have consulted two otolaryngologists in the Philippines and another two here in San Francisco in 1995. However, these doctors who tried to treat me were not familiar with Spasmodic Dysphonia, because it is a rare vocal disorder. People like me with this condition were also misdiagnosed usually for ten, fifteen or even twenty years. My first four doctors said that my vocal disorder has something to do with allergy. And so since 1992 I've been using nasal spray until finally a new doctor figured out what my problem was. That was before I came to St. Robert's in June, 2009.

Spasmodic Dysphonia is not a respiratory problem. It is a neurological condition. My brain cannot control the spasms in my vocal cord when I talk. The spasms strangle my speaking voice and that's why my voice goes down usually at the end of the sentence. The problem is that there is no cure because they haven't found out the cause. Research is ongoing. The doctor who diagnosed me correctly offered a relief from the spasms by giving me a Botox shot in my vocal cord. I tried it twice and it did help but only temporarily. And because it is not an FDA approved treatment, it is not covered by my health insurance. It is recommended that I get a Botox shot every six months and I pay almost a thousand dollars for every shot. Besides I also find it very inconvenient that 36 hours after the Botox shot my voice drops down to a whisper for the next 3 or 4 weeks. It's more than a year since I had my last Botox shot. This is why you may have noticed that my speech has become effortful. It makes me anxious to have this kind of vocal disorder but I am happy to know that the parishioners who are already aware of what my condition is are very understanding and supportive.

In his second letter to the Corinthians 12:7, St. Paul talks about a "thorn in the flesh" that God gave him in order to keep him from exalting himself. I am no St. Paul but we are both in the business of proclaiming God's word and I consider my vocal disorder as a sharing in the suffering of Christ. St. Paul asked the Lord three times that this thorn might depart from him and Christ said to him, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is perfected in weakness." Indeed, it is through God's grace that I am able to perform my ministry. Without God's grace I can do nothing.

# Living Liturgy

We Are All Beloved!

Jesus hears the words, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well-pleased." Actually, at our conception, the Father says the same words to each of us and looks on us with love throughout our lives. And not just to us, but to each child born. Since we are all children of the same Father, we have responsibilities to our brothers and sisters wherever they live.

"Our principal concern is our children. Because ultimately, that's who we're working to protect – the children whose lives and futures are most vulnerable to the dangers and deprivations of poverty... If you want to know how stable a country is, don't count the number of advanced weapons, count the number of undernourished children." (Hillary Rodham Clinton, Secretary of State) As previously announced, our Social Concerns group is asking parishioners to write letters next weekend about making our foreign aid focused on poverty reduction and responsive to local communities' actual needs. There are presently 12 departments and 25 agencies dealing with foreign assistance! Capitol Hill staff report that 96% of their members are influenced by personalized letters if they haven't already reached a decision on an issue. Expressing a personal experience of the issue adds weight to your letter as well. Legislators receive thousands of e-mails daily, so those aren't as effective.

We are fortunate that Barbara Boxer is the chair of the Senate Foreign Relations committee which will be reforming the 1961 Foreign Assistance Act. If you've never written to a senator before, please write this time! Hunger and poverty are non-partisan issues and cry out for our response. Children are welcome to write letters as well.

If you'd prefer to write your letter at home and bring it with you to Mass next weekend, here is a sample. Please use your own words and include your name and address at the bottom of the letter AND on the envelope.

Dear Senator Boxer,

I'm asking you to reform the way our country delivers foreign aid so it will help millions of people in poor countries to move out of hunger and poverty. Better streamlined aid, targeted according to local needs and partnering with local communities, will help the 200 million children world-wide who suffer from chronic malnutrition. How can children learn when they are starving? Moving people out of poverty will help foster economic growth and opportunity leading countries to the stability which will contribute to our own national security as well. Please let me know what progress your committee is making. Thank you. Your name and address

Be sure to bring your letter with you next weekend, so we can put it with the others written then. May the Lord bless our efforts to help the poorest of the poor.
