# Happy Easter!

When you say this greeting today, what comes to your mind? What does this greeting mean to people? The children would probably say that they like Easter because of the Easter eggs and the Easter bunny. These two are the popular symbols of Easter. And they are highly commercialized at this time. Well, Easter is supposed to be fun. Hence, the colorful trappings that come with the celebration of Easter Sunday. But let me tell you a very important symbol or sign of Easter. The Empty Tomb.

Why the empty tomb? In John's gospel, the empty tomb is the proof that Jesus has resurrected. However, it was not easy to understand right away the significance of the empty tomb. Magdalene and Peter saw the empty tomb but they did not associate it at once with the resurrection. Who did? The beloved disciple also saw the empty tomb and he believed. It was the disciple whom Jesus loved who instantly acknowledged that Jesus has risen. Why? Because he saw the empty tomb with the eyes of love.

It has been said that when you love, you will see. In the book, "The Little Prince" written by Antoine de Saint-Exupere, there is this beautiful quotation from the dialogue between the little prince and the fox who have become close friends, "It is only through the heart that one can see clearly, for what is essential is invisible to the eyes." Indeed, people in love can see more clearly. Because of that special relationship between Jesus and the beloved disciple, the truth about the empty tomb became very clear to that disciple.

Easter invites us to see everything through the eyes of love or through the eyes of faith. In one of his letters, Saint Paul says that we walk by faith, not by sight. When we love one another we are able to see the risen Lord in each one of us. Happy Easter is not a greeting that we can just say once a year. If we try to look at the world around us every day with the eyes love, then Easter becomes a 24/7 reality.



Jesus Christ Is Risen!

Happy Easter! Most of us have heard the Easter story many times. So this reflection will focus on some aspects of Matthew's version which we might have overlooked. When the women approach the tomb "as the first day of the week was dawning," the angel says to them, "Do not be afraid." When Jesus meets them on their way back home, he repeats this assurance. My favorite scripture scholar, Fr. Jude Siciliano, OP, asks, "Does it take more courage to believe in a Risen Savior than in an admired, but dead religious teacher? What does it mean in our lives that everything has changed for us?" Surely, those who followed Jesus, especially those who followed him through his passion and death experienced their lives as changed forever.

How about us? All of us who participated in any of the Easter Masses will have renewed our baptismal promises and have been sprinkled with the Easter water. Every time we bless ourselves at one of the holy water fonts at the entrance of the church, we are invited to do the same thing. If we don't do it merely as a habit, we ought to pray as we sign ourselves, "In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." These are the same words used at our baptism when someone else, usually our parents, wanted us to be part of God's family. So, now it is time to make that commitment to follow Jesus (or to renew it) for ourselves. The church wisely gives us 50 days to deepen this commitment, after our 40 days of preparation for this feast through our Lenten observance.

The dawning of the first day of the week has great meaning for Matthew. His listeners would know that he is saying that something very new is happening. It is an ordinary day; people are going about their daily lives and are back to work, having observed the Sabbath. "Don't expect resurrection appearances just on high holy days, Fr. Jude points out, "in dedicated places and under certain, ideal conditions. Look for the Risen One...in daily life, while doing ordinary chores. If the Risen Christ isn't with us where we work out our Christian lives, he is still in the grave." Jesus' resurrection is the reason why for us as Christians Sunday is our holy day instead of Saturday which the Jewish community observes.

So, the invitation comes to us this Easter : let us open our eyes and look for the signs of resurrection! New life in ourselves, in those we love, in efforts in our society to surround the poor and vulnerable with our care and our help, in struggles for human dignity and justice here at home and in North Africa and the Gulf states, so many places where God's Spirit is at work!

Some parishioners have asked why we wrote letters about making foreign aid (1% of the federal budget, though some people think it is 25%). The Social Concerns group hopes to spearhead one project reminding us of the needs of our global family and one project closer to home. Soon, we will be focusing on our efforts on providing food for the children of San Bruno who usually receive free or subsidized lunches during the school year. Of course, we'll be inviting your participation! Thank you in advance.
