Dear Parishioners,

In her Mother's Day proclamation 1870, Julia Ward Howe writes "Arise all women who have hearts! Say firmly we will not have questions decided by irrelevant agencies. Our husband's shall not come to us reeking of carnage, for caresses and applause. Let women meet first," Howe continues to be wailed and commemorate the dead. Let them solemnly take counsel with each other as to the means whereby the great human family can live in peace. Today 141 years later the rituals that surround Mother's Day include visit, family meals, and cards but little public council for peace. For many families Mother's Day is pink. Whole Families walk to end cancer. Thev Commemorate Family and Friends who have died by walking to raise money for research. They become rivers of pink-t-shirt on city streets.

Sunday is the day in the Christian calendar for remembering Jesus and celebrating his resurrection, for handing on teaching and mission. this Sunday's Gospel two In disheartened disciples find the risen Jesus present with them in the actions Christians do each Sunday: interpreting scripture and breaking bread. The two disciples who leave Jerusalem and head home to Emmaus in Sunday's Gospel have experienced a terrible loss. As disciples, they wrapped their lives around Jesus, who they expected would usher in the reign of God. Their hopes die at this crucifixion. The two disciples are walking away from not only the fact of Jesus' death but also from disturbing reports that he has been raised up.

Emmaus lies seven miles from Jerusalem, a walk long enough for a transforming conversation. The walk represents a whole process of moving from loss to new life, from Blindness to Faith. Today science calls us to new Emmaus walks so we can wrestle with the meaning of Jesus' death and Resurrection in our evolving cosmos and interfaith toward the future and cures to explore with him the transforming power of love.

"To all Mothers, Grandmothers and God-Mothers of St. Robert's Church and the world, have a blessed and wonderful mother's Day. Because of you Hope Lives within us.



Today's gospel is a marvelous story: two disciples, their hopes for freedom from the Romans dashed by Jesus' cruel death, are walking away from Jerusalem to Emmaus. Cleopas and likely his wife are joined by the Risen Jesus, but don't recognize him. They are understandably confused by the death of their teacher and friend, stories of an empty tomb and visions of angels. A stranger interprets everything the Jewish scriptures have to say about Jesus and they beg him to stay with them. He does and at table, he takes the bread, blesses it, breaks it and gives it to them and they recognize him! They say to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the scriptures to us?" And they trust their experience enough to return to Jerusalem, the place of his death, and rejoin the gathered community. What experiences of the Lord keep you believing? What is your experience of the Lord's presence at the Eucharist?

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts ...

To be three times holy — what might that mean? The beginning of the Holy, Holy, Holy acclamation in the Eucharistic Prayer is drawn from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah, a biblical book composed long before Jesus Christ revealed God as Three Persons.

To be three times holy in -that era was not about being three divine Persons! The הַדוֹש Hebrew word (kadosh) signifies a holiness that is something entirely distinct from common life. The delightful website, www.hebrew4





christians.com describes the meaning of what is holy in Isaiah 6:3 a s "singular" and "aweinspiring". The Lord

Holy, holy, holy! Lord God Almighty, Early in the morning our song shall rise to thee. Holy, holy, holy! Merciful and mighty, God in three persons, Blessed Trinity! "Holy, holy, holy! Lord God Almighty"

of hosts is three times holy, utterly beyond our understanding and imagination, yet paradoxically the earth is filled with God's glory. There is one, Jesus Christ, who comes in the name of the Lord; who both brings God's holiness into people's lives and who brings people into God's holiness. Hosanna! Save us now!

Entering into the great Eucharistic prayer through the gateway of the Holy, Holy, Holy is to be drawn deeply into the mystery of Christ by the Holy Spirit.
