Dear Parishioners,

It has been said that if you have the key, you have the power or the authority. That is very true. If you have the master key that can unlock and open all the doors, then you feel powerful. You can have access to places where others cannot. If you don't have the key, you are at the mercy of the one who has the key. You will only be allowed to borrow the key if there is a justification for its use. This is why people would rather have the key so that they can use it whenever and for whatever purpose. That is power. That is authority.

In this Sunday's gospel, Peter receives from the Christ the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Jesus tells Peter, "Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." This passage clearly establishes the primacy of Peter among the apostles. This primacy of Peter is given to his successor whom we now call the Pope or the Holy Father in Rome. However, the authority given to Peter or the Pope, for that matter, is not meant to dominate others. It is meant to reconcile us with one another and with God. It is also the power to forgive sins.

When the leaders of our nation or community fail to unite the people, they are not able to exercise the kind of authority that Christ bestows. For Christ, the key of authority is not meant to polarize or to divide the people. When one's leadership creates division we can certainly say that it is not the work of the Spirit. A Spirit-filled leadership is what we need today so that we can be one in pursuing the common good.

Most government officials call themselves public servants. Let us pray for these public servants around the world so that God's spirit may guide and inspire them to realize that authority comes with the responsibility to unite and reconcile all people. When they are able to do this, then they can be truly called public servants. By the way, did you know that when one is elected pope, he gets the title, 'Servus servorum Dei', which means, 'Servant of the servants of God'. Any takers?
