Dear Parishioners,

Today's readings are a bit challenging! The first reading speaks of God's call to a Gentile ruler who will defeat the Babylonians who had taken many Israelites into exile 50 years earlier. Isaiah is saying that God can use anyone, even a Gentile, to set his people free.

Last week, the priests gave the last catechetical session, explaining the various sections of the Mass, so they couldn't fully address the gospel. That passage presented the feast as a wedding celebration for the son of the king to which those invited won't come. We can easily assume that the king is God, especially hearing this reading at the Eucharist where we are invited to a feast! When he sends out another set of servants, some of those invited even kill them. Here the parable shifts. We know that God wouldn't destroy those who refused and take retaliation against a whole city. So what is the meaning of this allegory?

Barbara Reid, OP reminds us that this is the third in a series of parables directed at the religious leaders, those we'd expect to be open to God through Jesus' teaching. In that context, she says, this part of the reading refers to the killing of servants like John the Baptist by Herod and the destruction of Jerusalem by the Romans.

The question of being dressed appropriately also needs some explanation. Paul's letters frequently use the metaphor of putting on clothing to mean virtues one is including in one's life. "Put on then, as God's chosen ones, heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience." (Colossians 3.12) Just showing up isn't enough; guests must clothe themselves with good deeds and faithfulness. Maybe it would be like any of us coming to Mass, but then not making any effort to put into our lives the values of Jesus: love, forgiveness, generosity.

In this Sunday's reading, the religious leaders whom Jesus has challenged repeatedly are the ones questioning him. Should one pay the tax imposed by the Romans or not? Theirs is not an honest question, but a desire to trip him up. His response cleverly leaves the decision up to them, but focuses on what belongs to God. Some committed Catholics like Archbishop Hunthausen (former Archbishop of Seattle) withheld the percentage of his taxes used to stockpile nuclear weapons. Others pay taxes but lobby, vote and nonviolently protest to promote federal spending on needed social programs. Jesus' response provides much food for thought.

Paul gives thanks to God for the Thessalonians' "work of faith, labor of love and endurance in hope." May we thank God for these same fruits in each other.







"Lamb of God, ..." Litanies and the "Lamb of God"

Perhaps one of the most popular prayers for Catholics is the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Another well-known prayer is the Litany of the Saints sung before the baptismal rite at the Easter Vigil. The use of repeated refrains or responses goes back to the Old Testament, as in Psalm 136, which repeats the refrain, "God's love endures forever," after each acclamation of praise. In the

Church, refrains in litanies are usually short prayers of petition: "hear us, O Lord... have mercy on us...pray for us." The "Lamb of God" is a brief litany that accompanies the breaking of the consecrated bread: an act that follows Jesus' own example Where after the blessing he broke the

bread before giving it to the disciples. The "Breaking of the Bread" is the sign of Jesus being shared among us and it acts as a bridge as we "process" from the sign of peace to the reception of Communion. The words of the "Lamb of God" focus on Jesus the sacrificial lamb offered up for us in the Eucharist as we beg for mercy and for the peace we have expressed in the sign of peace shared moments earlier.
