

WEEKLY READINGS

A Puzzling Parable

Commentators differ on the meaning of this particular gospel. Jude Siciliano, OP interprets it in the way we are accustomed to hearing. While acknowledging that the talents in the gospel are units of money, he sees the talents as God-given qualities which we are obliged to use for the good of others, not to be buried or ignored. As all of us are aware, muscles and minds develop when they are used. So money "develops" when it invested or utilized. From this perspective, the landowner praises those who multiplied his money and the one who didn't is punished.

Another Dominican scholar, Barbara Reid, OP interprets the passage quite differently. She explains that in Jesus' time, there wasn't a capitalist system and that "people had a notion of limited goods: there is only so much wealth, and any increase to one person takes away from another." ("Unmasking Greed," <u>America</u>, Nov. 13) In this interpretation, the third servant is the honorable one, since he refuses to cooperate in a system in which one person becomes extremely wealthy while others are in need. In this light, the last verse shows what can happen to those who blow the whistle on the rich and powerful. The disciples are encouraged to stand together as they confront unjust systems, "not to be found in a vulnerable solitary position," like the third servant.

Our bishops and all the social justice groups in the country are asking us **this week** to contact the Super Committee charged with reducing the deficit by \$1.5 trillion over the next ten years. Programs that serve poor and vulnerable people at home and abroad –though they did not cause the financial crisis – are in danger of drastic cuts. Budgets are moral documents, the bishops remind us, and they plead with us to draw a Circle of Protection about poor and hungry people. Poverty-focused international aid is only 1% of the budget, not the 25% most Americans think. Millions of people will die without the food, medicine and assistance that piece of the budget provides. Post-Communion Prayer

The brief silent preparation for Communion and the longer silent reflection and prayer that follows

after Communion frame the act of Holy Communion itself. We cannot reminded be enough of the great Sacrament we have received nor can we ever fully fathom the depths of itsi mystery. After a time of silence (or after a n appropriate song hymn) the or priests offers the "Post-Communion" Prayer, which sums up what we have received and asks that we may experience its full effects in our lives. This prayer ends the Communion Rite and is not a "concluding prayer"



ON **THE GIRM***

"When the distribution of communion is finished, as circumstances suggest, the priest and faithful spend some time praying privately. If desired, a psalm or other canticle of praise or hymn may also be sung by the entire congregation.

To bring to completion the prayer of the People of God, and also to conclude the entire Communion Rite, the priests says the Prayer after Communion, in which he prays for the fruits of the mystery just celebrated."
