Dear Parishioners,

The gospel for this last Sunday of the Church's year presents us with the Last Judgment, when Jesus comes as Shepherd King. In the first reading from the prophet Ezekiel, we hear of a devoted shepherd who tends his sheep, binds up the injured, heals the sick, and gives all of them rest, echoing Psalm 23. And it is this sort of king whom we honor today, not the dictatorial ruler whom we've recently seen forced from power. We know this gospel passage almost by heart: "I was hungry and you gave me to eat. I was thirsty and you gave me to drink..."

These words have deeper meaning when we consider the experiences of our human family this past year. Our recession has left one out of four children and one out of five adults facing hunger from unacceptably high numbers of willing workers unemployed or underemployed with Hispanic and Black men most affected. Health care reform continues to be hotly debated as insurance premiums rise. Corporations are still handing out ridiculous \$35 million payouts to deposed CEO's as college students (and their families) struggle with ever-increasing tuition and debt. We've seen flooding in Thailand and several island communities and the failure of rice crops in China and North Korea as climate change wrecks havoc on poorer parts of the globe.


There are systemic changes needed in our country and in our world which are daunting to the most astute among us. But one action we can take is to let the members of Super Committee reducing the deficit know that we don't want programs for those in need drastically cut. Since there is a burden to be shared, it must be distributed fairly and in keeping with the best values of our country. Poverty-focused foreign assistance will literally mean life or death for millions of those receiving our help.

Thank you for your contributions to the Campaign for Human Development which funds community-based efforts here at home. announcements, the priest will offer the final blessing. After the blessing is completed the priest or deacon will offer the dismissal. The Missal has adapted new wording for the dismissal stemming from a recent synod of bishops. All of them incorporate the action of entering the world with a mission, "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord," "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life" are a few examples. Each time we gather for liturgy we hear the word of God, we are nourished at the table of the Lord and we are transformed to conform to the image of the Lord. The dismissal at the end of liturgy reminds us that we can't stay; we must go forth and spread the spirit of Christ. We must embrace and carry out the mission that has been entrusted to us by Jesus .
