Dear Parishioners;

In our first reading this Sunday, Isaiah announces to the people of Israel (long held captive in Babylon) a new exodus from captivity to the Promised Land. This exodus would be even greater than the one from Egypt: Instead of a perilous, meandering journey through the rugged and mountainous wilderness, this time God would take them straight home, subduing wild beast and hostile forces along the way, and making their path smooth and level.

We hear echoes of Isaiah's words in today's Gospel, as John the Baptist is identified as the voice of one crying out in the desert: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make **straight his paths."** John is announcing a new exodus for God's people, proclaiming One mightier than I is coming after me, and preparing the people for the coming of Jesus. It was Jesus who revealed the deeper and more definitive nature of the exodus He came to lead - an exodus not from captivity to earthly rulers, but from captivity to sin and death... an exodus not journeyed on foot by the people, but accomplished by Jesus through the cross, shared with his followers by Baptism, and lived together with them in our journey of faith.

This season of Advent we prepare the way of the Lord to our own hearts as Jesus seeks to bring this new exodus to fulfillment in us, leading us – not to some earthly Promised Land, but to the fullness of life in God's Kingdom.



The Richness of Advent


Last Sunday, we heard the pleading of Isaiah's community returning from exile, yet feeling guilty and abandoned by their Lord. They admit their fault, yet are so confident of God's unfailing love they continue to address God as "our father" in the midst of their anguish. The exquisite image of the potter and the clay is one we can all relate to. Aren't there times we feel "misshapen" or off-kilter, when our lives are out of balance? How easily we forget that we are "the work of [God's] hands."

This Sunday, we hear Isaiah being commanded by God to "Comfort, give comfort to my people... Speak tenderly to Jerusalem." As we often do, they interpret their suffering as due to their sins. But Isaiah also speaks of God as a gentle shepherd carrying the little lambs. The people will eventually be led home by a "voice of one crying out in the desert," a messenger of the Lord. Mark's account is the first one to use the word "gospel" meaning "good news." His community, nourished by the Hebrew scriptures, remembers Isaiah's description of the messenger and sees John the Baptist as God's fulfillment of that promise.

The second reading from 2 Peter is the only place in the scriptures which describes a fiery conflagration before the "new heavens and a new earth" come to be. Surrounded as we are by global tragedies and suffering, we need to reaffirm that God is already bringing about the new heavens and new earth. We'll hear another vision of God's desire for our world next week in the reading from Isaiah 61. "Another world is not only possible; she is on her way. On a quiet day, I can hear her breathing." Arundhati Roy, Indian novelist and activist

The readings and songs of Advent give us the opportunity, if we choose to take it, to slow down a bit, even in the midst of the craziness, and make space for the Lord in our cluttered lives. May we be reshaped and "thrown" again by the master Potter of our lives!
