Dear Friends,

I quietly slide open the door and get a fleeting glimpse of my white butterfly. For him it may not be---but for me it is much too cold to sit outside on our deck. I turn up the heat; sit here in Gene's big blue chair; look over the readings for this week and sip Candy Cane tea. As always, I ask Gene to give me a few inspiring thoughts to share with you.

This Third Sunday of Advent falls between two special feasts of Our Blessed Mother - The Feast of the Immaculate Conception and the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. I close my eyes and imagine this 15 year old girl (the same age as our grand-daughter Katie) enjoying a peaceful, ordinary day in Nazareth. Perhaps she is daydreaming at her special "away-from-everyone-else" place under her favorite tree in the shady olive grove. Suddenly the Angel Gabriel appears before her. Mary is startled and very much afraid. His words are a puzzle to her. "How could it be that she would conceive and bear a son? How could her cousin Elizabeth, who is so very old, be in the sixth month of her pregnancy?" To reassure her and calm her fears, Gabriel tells Mary, "nothing will be impossible for God". Mary believes his words and wonders, "What do I do now?" Swiftly the answer comes to her. "Elizabeth needs me."

Today we read Isaiah's prophesy --- Our Savior will bring glad tidings to the poor; the brokenhearted will be healed and this will be a year of favor from the Lord. Mary (more than anyone of us) waits in joyful anticipation for the coming of her baby. How does Mary wait? She puts aside her own concerns and sets out to the hill country. I see a cheerful group of neighbors accompanying her? (Her mom and dad would never let her travel alone.) At her greeting as she enters Elizabeth's house, Elizabeth's baby leaps in her womb. He recognizes his Lord! The Holy Spirit, in that instant, inspires her to say to Mary: "Most blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb."

Paul then tells us to: "Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus." How does Mary rejoice? How does she pray without ceasing? How does she give thanks? Mary's prayer is a prayer of action. She brings Jesus to Elizabeth. She tenderly reaches out to help her elderly cousin prepare for the birth of her son, John the Baptist -- the prophet of whom today's Gospel speaks.

What do we do now as we wait for the coming of Christ? How can we (like Mary) bring Jesus to our world? Is there someone close to us who needs our help? Are there hungry people for whom we can provide food? Can we put smiles on the faces of parents and their children who have given up hope of having a joyous Christmas? Can we visit someone who is lonely or ill? Can we make a caring phone call? Send a cheerful note? As we watch and wait, there is something each of us can do --- we can let our actions speak these words: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because He has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor, to heal the brokenhearted."

May you be blessed with a fruitful Advent and a very Merry Christmas!



From the Pastor's Desk Simbang Gabi

On the first Sunday of Advent we started using the new translation of the mass. As per my observation there were a few lapses on the part of the congregation and the presiders. It is said that we are creatures of habit and it will take some time to adjust to the changes in the mass. Most of the changes in the mass are the parts spoken by the presiders. When saying the mass I am very focused on the missal so that I can familiarize myself with the new translation quickly. I urge all of you to use the mass response card at all times when attending the mass.

Christmas is just around the corner. Our parish and school community have scheduled many activities and events to commemorate the birth our Savior meaningfully. There are Christmas drives to solicit gifts in cash and kind to be shared with the less fortunate among us. Every year St. Robert's does a very good job to make sure that there many smiling faces, especially children's, when they receive their Christmas gifts and wishes. Our parish organizations are also doing their customary Christmas get-together or parties to strengthen our community spirit. Christmas is really a time of sharing and having fun as a community.

However, let us not forget the reason for the season. We do all these activities because of Jesus. His birth is God's greatest gift to us. We express our gratitude by sharing our blessings with others. Another way of giving thanks to God for the gift of His Son is, of course, through prayers. A spiritual preparation for Christmas is in order so that we don't truly miss the reason for the celebration of Christmas.

For nine days before Christmas we celebrate *Simbang Gabi* here at St. Robert's. *Simbang Gabi* is a typical Filipino way of preparing for the great feast of Christmas. Originally it was known as *Misa Aguinaldo*. *Aguinaldo* means gift. And gift is peculiar to Christmas. In the Philippines, the faithful wake up early morning for nine days before Christmas to join in the celebration of the dawn mass. The faithful make this their "*Aguinaldo*" to God for the great gift of Jesus. The practice can also be understood as the preparation of the faithful to receive from God the great gift or "*Aguinaldo*" of Christmas, which is Jesus, the Savior of the world.

Through the years the celebration of the nine-day *Misa Aguinaldo* has evolved so much so that instead of just the nine-day dawn masses, the *Misa Aguinaldo* masses are also celebrated in the evening. Hence the term, *Simbang Gabi*, which literally means evening mass.

The Filipino immigrant community has brought this practice to America as a gift to our community of faith. This practice is officially recognized by the Archdiocese of San Francisco and is being done in more than 40 parishes in the archdiocese. For many Filipino Catholics, *Simbang Gabi* is an expression of their filial devotion to Mary, the Mother of God. For nine consecutive days, they join and accompany her, so to speak, as she awaits the birth of her Son. What could be a better way to prepare for the celebration of Christmas than that of Mary, a woman of faith?

I invite all my parishioners to join us in celebrating Simbang Gabi on December 15 to 23 at 7:00 PM. Fellowship in the hall follows after each mass. Let us join Mary in this novena-masses as we await with joy the birth of Jesus, the reason for the season.

God's Dream for the World

We hear from Isaiah again today and God's dream for the world is repeated: a year of favor from the Lord. This phrase, unfamiliar to us, refers to the Jubilee Year which was to be observed every 49 years: the land was left fallow; impoverished landowners (who sold their land from dire need) received their land back; slaves were set free, and debts cancelled. "There would be no accumulation of wealth and vast land holdings," according to Jude Siciliano, OP in (First Impressions, Dec.4). He also comments that because of the radical nature of the Jubilee Year, it was probably never actually observed in Israel.

You might recall that Jesus quotes this lovely piece of Isaiah when he stands up to read in the synagogue as related in Luke 4.16-30. At the end of the proclamation, he states, "Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing." One can imagine what his well-to-do listeners would think, knowing how much they would lose if the Jubilee Year were enacted somehow through Jesus. "Who does he think he is?" "He is going to turn our world upside down!" No wonder they are enraged and want to throw him over the cliff. (Lk. 4.30)

Seeing the consistent generosity of so many of you in our parish, I can only thank you for helping God's dream, expressed in Jesus, to be fulfilled. I feel challenged by two reflections which I came across at this halfway point of Advent, and I offer them for your reflection as well.

"We must first be drawn to and changed by the adult Christ. Then we will see the significance of his birth among us. Unless he has changed our life and we have absorbed his ways, the infant in the manger will just be a cute baby displayed in a picturesque setting." Jude Siciliano, OP

"If this is going to be a Christian nation that doesn't help the poor, either we have to pretend that Jesus was just as selfish as we are, or we've got to acknowledge that he commanded us to love the poor and serve the needy without condition and then admit that we just don't want to do it." Stephen Colbert

May we continue to make space in our hearts and our lives for the coming of the Lord!
