Dear Parishioners,

When Allied forces arrived in Nazi concentration camps to liberate prisoners held there at the end of WWII, many people held captive didn't understand what was happening or simply acted as if they were imagining what they saw. After a few years of continual suffering in captivity, many had given up hope of ever seeing freedom again, so being liberated seemed surreal. And some of them never really 'came back', spending their remaining years intellectually and emotionally detached from reality.

Imagine being an Allied soldier trying to explain to people who fell into that despair that their captivity was ending, and instead of cheers and tears, seeing only dazed looks in return. The people of Israel had been held captive in Babylon for over ten times as long by the time God announced through Isaiah their impending freedom, and they seemed even less willing or able to comprehend the news.

Using imagery already familiar to them, God made the point that what was about to happen would be no less than another exodus from captivity to freedom, from desolation to consolation, and from separation to reunion. Recalling the earlier exodus from Egypt helped them understand and embrace the news.

Our Eucharistic celebration acknowledges and embraces the same sort of dynamics put into action by Jesus, whose incarnation, life, suffering, death, and resurrection are a definitive exodus from captivity to sin and death, to sanctity and life. We gather to give thanks for this, to embrace it, and to internalize it. We walk this journey of faith together to deepen our participation in this exodus, and to bear the fruits of faith, justice, and mercy in it.

Many people have already reached a point of despair in this life, though – resigned to live out the remainder of our days held captive by a world not of our making, and feeling oppressed by limits, imperfections, and injustices not of our choosing. Hearing news of our impending release through the self-giving love of Jesus can be hard for us to hear, to comprehend, or to accept. So we reach out to encourage each other, to walk together on this exodus, and to experience for ourselves God's hand in preparing a safe path through the wilderness, and removing obstacles and hazards along the way to the fullness of life in Christ.



Our Lenten Project

Unless you're new here, you'll recall that each Lent we have taken on a parish project. (Last Lent, we had plans underway for our Summer Lunch Bunch effort, and didn't want to ask twice for your financial support.) This Lent, we wish to expand on our summer effort and invite each of us to be ambassadors for the various food programs offered through the Second Harvest Food Bank for the one out of seven families who need them. Beginning NEXT Sunday, we'll have fliers for you available in multiple languages describing all the food programs available: Brown Bag, Family Harvest, and CalFresh (used to be called SNAP and before that, food stamps). The fliers also have an 800 number which a family or individual can call to find the location of the closest place they can get emergency food.

So, we're asking you next weekend (and throughout Lent) to take some fliers with you and give them to your neighbors, coworkers, relatives and friends. I've found it easy to approach someone, handing a flier and saying, "You might know someone who would find this helpful." Even if you're pretty sure that the person himself or herself is the one in need, this way, there's no embarrassment. Bring some to your place of work or ask an owner if you can post one on a store bulletin board. These fliers are for San Mateo County, but I'm looking into what San Francisco County has available as well.

Many of those involved in this project also belong to our parish St. Vincent de Paul and we are coordinating with them. The food bank programs are set up to provide food for large numbers of people on a regular basis. Our parish SVDP, of necessity, can only provide limited food assistance when requested. In the Isaiah reading, the Lord says, "See I am doing something new!" May the Lord bless this new endeavor of ours for his people.
