Dear Parishioners.

Several years ago I had an opportunity to go to the desert in Egypt. I was with a group of pilgrims. The desert can be very intimidating, especially if one is in a remote area of the desert, far away from civilization. But the desert can be an interesting place for discovery. The great pyramids of Egypt are in the desert as well as other historical sites. In the Scriptures the desert is considered as a place where important events take place. The Israelites became a nation after wandering in the desert for forty years. It is in the desert where God invited them to a covenant. The great prophets like Elijah and John the Baptist lived and preached in the desert. In today's gospel reading we heard that Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert and there he was tempted by Satan and the angels ministered to him.


The desert is a place of self-discovery. In the course of their history, whenever the Israelites forget who they are, the prophets remind them to go back to the desert to remember who they are, that is, a people in a covenant with God. The desert is also a place of temptation. This is where Jesus was tested by Satan. We say that we get to know ourselves better after we have been tested. During testing we discover our strengths as well as our weaknesses. The period or time of testing is our own desert-experience.

The season of Lent provides us an opportunity to have our own desert-experience. The disciplines of Lent, namely, prayer, fasting and abstinence, enable us to look into ourselves so that we can discover who we truly are. It is the Holy Spirit who will lead us into this desert-experience just as Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert. And because the desert is a place of self-discovery, we will discover who we truly are. We are God's children by virtue of baptism. In our desert-experience we may tempted by Satan to forget who we are but we will able to overcome Satan's temptations if we keep in mind that the Holy Spirit is with us because of our baptism.

Lent is the time when our catechumens prepare for the final stages of their preparation to be baptized or to receive the sacraments of initiation. For the rest of us who have been baptized, Lent is the time to take a look again at our baptism and ponder what it means to be baptized into Jesus. When we have done this during Lent, our renewal of baptism on Easter Sunday becomes more meaningful and we are able to celebrate our being children of God.


