## Dear Parishioners,

The evangelists write for a third generation after Jesus, a generation that will meet Jesus in story and breaking of bread, a generation like our own.

Luke writes to make present for new generations what Jesus taught and what Israel's prophets promised. Remembering does more than bring past events to mind. Remembering puts past events in a whole new context. Without remembering together, we forget or never learn things vital to the meaning of our lives and to the loves that bind us together. We celebrate birthdays, Mother's day, Father's day as days to remember how people matter to us.

We remember not only to hold onto the past but also to re-imagine and transform the future. On April 22nd each year we celebrate Earth Day. We remember Earth sustains us in order to build awareness we must live in harmony with our planet's capacity to renew itself.

In the last chapter of his gospel, Luke pictures Jesus' disciples remembering what Jesus taught and interpreting the meaning of his death and resurrection. In each story disciples are remembering Jesus' teaching and reinterpreting the apparent failure of his crucifixion in light of the unfolding news of his resurrection. They are remembering and talking over all that happened to Jesus. Jesus is the stone the builders reject that becomes the cornerstone.

The process of remembering and trying to understand events stir their deepest hope of new life. We continue each process each time we wrestle with the meaning of the scriptures for ourselves.

Thus it was written and so it happened that the Messiah is to suffer and rise from the dead on the third day. Christians still keep Sundays by gathering, remembering Jesus, interpreting events in our world in the light of scripture, and breaking bread together as he asked. In small Christian communities Christians gather to interpret their lives and events in the world in the light of scriptures.
