Dear Parishioners,

Today we hear the wonderful image of the vine and the branches. If you go to Napa throughout the year, you've seen the autumn loveliness of the vineyards change to the craggy barrenness of winter to the bright greening of springtime. Could it be that our being branches on the vine of the Lord experience those same seasons? If you're a regular at a particular Mass, you may have noticed some unfamiliar faces. Perhaps, it's their greening time urged by the Holy Spirit! Sometimes, it's joyous news like a long-sought-after pregnancy or the weight of a frightening medical report which brings people back to church. It may seem an insignificant action, but whatever their reasons may be, please reach out to them and welcome them!

This gospel passage closes with the words: "By this is my Father glorified, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples." Most of us probably aren't called to do big things as disciples, but how do we bear fruit? We are a great parish with wonderful people, but let me suggest two small, practical ways which would help us bear fruit not just as individuals, but as a parish community.

Have you ever wanted to sing during Mass, but noticed that no one else around you is? What would it be like if you and those around you decided to sing? I'm especially aware that during Masses when the children's choir sings there is a tendency to watch them instead of letting them lead us in song! If we want our children to be "full, active participants" as Vatican II directed us to be, we'll need to lead by example.

The other place which expresses our discipleship is our courtesy in the parking lots. Two weeks ago, someone needed to leave for medical reasons and was unable to because she was blocked in. If you're mobile, what would it be like if you parked in the upper parking lot or across the street in the park? And if someone in your family always runs late and that's why you double-park, could you commit yourselves to leaving home earlier? I'm sure that parishioners who do have mobility challenges would be most grateful if they could park closer to the church. Thank you for considering these small ways of bearing more fruit! Peace, S. 


