Dear Friends,

It is a bit breezy as I sit here on our deck, sipping Hawaiian Pineapple tea. I am watching and waiting for Gene's white butterfly to appear. My daughter Jeannie has surrounded me with many pots containing colorful petunias, primroses and orange and yellow marigolds. As I look over the readings for today, I ask Gene to let some words or phrases pop out at me.

It is the feast of the Ascension of Jesus into Heaven. He has completed the work given to Him by His Father. He has laid down His life for us that our sins would be forgiven. Jesus has shown us the way we are to live that we may be His "witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth". After Jesus has ascended to our Father two angels stand beside His disciples and say to them: "Why are you standing there looking at the sky?"

Perhaps they are overwhelmed by Jesus' words and the sight of Him ascending beyond the clouds.

They may be thinking: "How can we be witnesses to the ends of the earth? We've never been more than 30 miles away from Jerusalem!" Jesus tells them and tells us how --- He says: "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you." Each of us has received this power. The Holy Spirit came to dwell within us at our Baptism and then again at our Confirmation. He truly lives within us. He will help us be Christ's witnesses by guiding us in all that we say and do. All we need to do is to listen to that small voice that speaks to our heart.

We each have received Jesus' call: "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." This doesn't mean we have all been called to be missionaries, or preachers, or teachers, or prophets. But we have been called, as Paul tells us in the second reading: "to live in a manner worthy of the call you have received with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another through love."

Last month I wrote to you about "The Butterfly Effect". Everything we say or do has an effect upon others. Spreading God's Word to all the world starts with us --- an attentive ear, a kind word, a thoughtful act, a generous gift, a smile, a hug flows forth from us and forever impacts all the earth.

Wow, Gene's white butterfly just fluttered by!

The Holy Spirit's Action

Last Sunday's first reading was amazing! "In truth, I see that God shows no partiality. Rather in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him." Perhaps, you recalled the understanding that Peter's community must have had as they heard these words: they were the Chosen People and consequently, they would be the only ones saved. From the rest of the reading, we learned that the listeners were both Jews and Gentiles (non-Jews) and that the Jews were "astounded" that the Holy Spirit had been "poured out" on the Gentiles as well as themselves.

Do you remember being taught as a child that any sincere person, trying to follow his or her conscience would be saved, even without becoming Catholic? It is most likely passages like this which led to that teaching. The bishops of the Second Vatican Council, the highest teaching authority of the Church, asserted that other Christian faith traditions also contain truth. The introduction to the Decree on Ecumenism states, "The Council goes beyond the assertion that the Catholic Church is the true Church to assert that Jesus, in His Spirit, is at work in the Churches and Communities beyond the visible borders of the Catholic Church...that believers in Christ who are baptized are truly reborn and truly our brothers [and sisters] and that God uses their worship to sanctify and save them." (The Documents of Vatican II, p. 338) It was Blessed John XXII who called the members of other churches "separated brethren" for the first time.

Surely, we all know people who live out the gospel mandate, "Love one another as I love you" though they don't belong to any Church and may not even profess belief in God. The action of the Spirit, whose coming we'll celebrate next week on Pentecost, knows no bounds. May we be attentive to the Spirit's presence this coming week! Peace, S. Sheral

Public Policy Corner

Hello, my name is Arlo Uriarte. I have been asked by Father Obet and Mrs. Wright to provide the Parish and School with periodic information about the Catholic position on important policies and government action that affect us all. After attending an Archdiocese training and reading materials available to all of us through CACATHOLIC.ORG it is my honor to help all of you learn about important issues and hopefully inspire some to get involved and get their Catholic voices heard.

Current ISSUES

ABORTION: An effort to expand abortion service in California failed in a Senate Committee this week. SB 1338 Abortion (Kehoe, D-San Diego) sought to authorize nurse practitioners, physician's assistants and certified nurse midwives to perform first trimester aspiration abortions without the direct supervision of a licensed abortionist.

RELIGIOUS FREEDOM: On April 12, 2012, the U.S. bishops issued a strong call to action to defend religious liberty and urged laity to work to protect the First Freedom of the Bill of Rights. They outlined their position in "Our First, Most Cherished Freedom."

The SAFE initiative: to replace the death penalty with life without parole - has officially qualified for the November ballot. Stay tuned for more information in the months ahead.

The June 5, 2012 BALLOT: On the ballot are just two initiatives: Propositions 28 and 29. The 2012 June primary ballot will be the last primary or special election ballot to include propositions for the voters to consider. The bishops have not taken a position on either of the initiatives, but ask that you prayerfully consider your vote in light of Catholic teaching.
