Dear Parishioners,

Growing up in the Philippines I had the unfortunate experience of being compared to my older brother. I am the second child in a brood of six. My parents would always tell their friends that my older brother was smarter, the better singer and dancer. And that was true. I always felt uncomfortable whenever my parents did something like that. On hindsight, it could have one of the main reasons why I decided to enter the seminary at a very young age. I was twelve and leaving home and studying in the seminary was a convenient way of avoiding being compared to my older sibling. My older brother could have been a very successful engineer but he guit college a year before his graduation because he found a well-paying job in a pharmaceutical company. Sadly that decision did not help him later when he got laid off. Landing a decent job without a college degree became almost impossible for him to do.

I stayed in the seminary for thirteen years and I must say that while going through seminary formation I discovered my gifts and was able to nurture them to help me become a priest. Since then I would often say in jest that when I was ordained a priest, suddenly I became the favorite son.

Cervantes, the author of "The Man from La Mancha," once said, "All comparisons are odious." Comparisons breed hate. It is said that one of the cruelest and stupidest things a husband can do is compare his wife to another woman, especially to his mom. All of us, at one point, may have been guilty of comparing people to others or have felt the sting of being compared unfavorably to some other person. How do we avoid this trap?

Today's Feast of the Pentecost can show us the way. In this Sunday's second reading from the first letter to the Corinthians, Saint Paul states, "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone."

When we focus on our gifts we tend to become conceited if they are greater than someone else's or we feel dejected if our gifts are inferior. Saint Paul urges us to recognize the Giver of the gifts, because the Giver is superior to any gift. Our gifts are precious not in themselves, but because of the Giver. On this Pentecost Sunday let us acknowledge the Source of all blessings, the Holy Spirit, the Advocate whom the Father sends in Jesus' name.

The Gift of the Spirit

Today is the culmination of the Easter season. This great feast of Pentecost, so named because it is 50 days after Passover, comes with visible and audible signs from the most elemental forces known – wind and fire. The Acts reading stirs our hearts if we let it and perhaps, reminds us of our own confirmation in our faith, whether as teenagers or through the crucible of suffering and doubt as adults. The Spirit sends out the frightened disciples now empowered to preach and act as instruments, as the very presence of the Risen Lord. We, too, are sent forth to bring the values of the kingdom of God into the here and now of our world.

The budget proposed by Rep. Paul Ryan, a Catholic, and passed by the House of Representatives, would cut food stampsto 40 million Americans, 85% of them families with children. He has stated that churches could make up the difference, though doing so would cost every local faith community \$50,000. Also slated for a major cut is WIC, the highly successful supplementary nutritional program for women, infants and children. Our national Bishops' conference and national conferences of every faith tradition are pleading with legislators to create a Circle of Protection around these programs which sustain the poorest among us, especially in this economic downturn. Please write to our congresspersons and ask for their commitment to the Circle of Protection. You might also spend the coming week aware of the Holy Spirit's presence within you, guiding you in all your relationships and decisions. Peace, S. Sheral
