Dear Friends,

I sit here on our deck, sipping Hawaiian Mango tea. In the warmth of the afternoon sun (surrounded by red, white and purple petunias and yellow and orange marigold), I look over today's readings. Closing my eyes, I ask Gene to help me write this note to you. I slowly open my eyes --- Lo and behold, here comes Gene's white butterfly! He circles my head 2 or 3 times and quickly flutters away.

In today's Gospel, Jesus feeds the 5,000 people who have come to hear His words. They are so enthralled by Him that they don't even realize they are hungry. All they know is they want to be here with Jesus. Jesus knows they need food to sustain them. Jesus cares and provides for them.

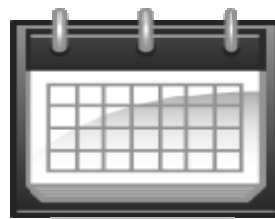
This is the same Jesus who loves each of us totally and unconditionally. It isn't our perfect performance that pleases Him. We need not make things happen by ourselves. Jesus wants us to lean on Him. All we have to do is seek Jesus; listen to Jesus; talk with Him (as we would talk to our best friend) and trust in Him. He will give us all we need so we can do whatever He asks of us. The little boy gives his five barley loaves and two fish to Jesus. Jesus blesses them. The boy's small gift is enough to feed 5,000 people with 12 baskets left over.

We may not think the gifts we have are enough to do much good in this world; but God has chosen each of us for a special purpose. Give all: mind, soul, body, talents, ability to God. Keep reaching out to others; do good for others. Keep doing what you know God wants you to do over and over again. Do it and pray! Trust that God is with us all the way. He blesses the good that we do and multiplies it a thousand-fold. Making good things happen for other people gives us joy. When we experience joy, it is God letting us know He is here and is blessing us. Let us also be a blessing to others.

**GROWING IN THE KNOWLEDGE OF
CATHOLIC FAITH**

In January, the Archdiocese began *Forward in Faith*, a two semester program designed to enrich the doctrinal understanding and personal faith of adult Catholics. The first semester was extremely successful, enrolling more than one thousand six hundred men and women who attended weekly sessions consisting of forty minute on-line lectures from the faculty of Boston College, followed by thirty minute small group discussions of the lecture.

During the week of September 11th, the second semester will begin, and there is a limited number of spots available for new students. This semester's nine evenings of faith will focus on the sacramental life of the Church and include lectures from Father Michael Himes, Father Robert Barron, Cardinal Donald Wuerl, and Kathleen Chesto. Each session starts at 7:00 p.m. and is offered at the following locations: Saint Cecilia, Saint Elizabeth, Saint Vincent de Paul, Notre Dame des Victoires and Star of the Sea in San Francisco; Saint Charles, Saint Bartholomew, Mater Dolorosa and Our Lady of Mercy in San Mateo County; and Saint Hilary and Saint Isabella in Marin County.
