Prepare the way of the Lord,
make straight his paths.
Every valley shall be filled and
every mountain and hill shall be made low.
The winding roads shall be made straight
and the rough ways made smooth.

This proclamation, given by the prophet Isaiah to Israel to announce release from her long captivity in Babylon, are echoed in the cry of John the Baptist in the desert by the Jordan River. Through Isaiah, God was consoling the people that they would have a new Exodus to the Promised Land; but unlike the first Exodus, the Lord would bring them straight home, removing obstacles and hardships to speed their way.

John's proclamation was announcing a new kind of Exodus: not just from captivity to worldly oppressors, but from captivity to sin and eternal death. Christ, himself, is the way, and people follow him to find the direct route to the new Promised Land – the fullness of life, eternally, in God.

Let us open our hearts in this Advent season, removing obstacles to God through Reconciliation, and so *prepare the way* for Christ to fill our lives anew with his own, through the miracle of Christmas.





he Nativity of Jesus was first celebrated in the Philippines in 1565. The Christmas celebration began with a novena of Masses starting on December 16 and ending on December 24 with a noche buena (a Christmas family dinner) after the midnight Mass. This novena was called Misa de Aguinaldo or Gift Masses. Since each of the novena Masses started at dawn with the cock's crow, the Masses later became know as Misa de Gallo. The Christmas novena became one of the best loved and most celebrated traditions in all parts of the Philippines. To this day, in most rural areas in the Philippines, people attend the Misa de Gallo at 4:00 or 5:00 o'clock in the morning. The faster pace of life in metropolitan cities necessitated some adjustments in the time of the novena of Masses. Some churches began to offer Christmas novena masses in the evening. Hence, the name Misa de Gallo was changed to Simbana Gabi (Night Mass). Today, whether the liturgies are celebrated at dawn or at night, the novena of Christmas Masses is simply called Simbang Gabi. This practice is now being observed not only in the Philippines but in other parts of the world.

Filipino-Americans have introduced Simbang Gabi in the United States and have found it to be an effective way to build a community of faith, to express who they are as a people, to celebrate their religious tradition and culture.

Here at St. Robert's Church, Simbang Gabi will be celebrated from December 15-23 (vigil mass) at 7:00 PM. Different priests and choirs will join us in each community celebration as we intensify our preparation on the final week of Advent.
