Dear Parishioners,

Welcome back to the school year routine, whether or not there's anyone in your household in school! Seems as though the pace of life now shifts for all of us.

Monday is Labor Day, which invites us to reflect on our work, whether highly esteemed or often taken for granted. Finding a balance between its demands, the needs of your children, grandchildren or elderly parents has to be more difficult than ever.

Time for reflection has become rare. Here is one small suggestion. In times past, we used to say a prayer called the Morning Offering which had as its purpose to sanctify the whole day before us. We offered everything the day brought to God for a particular intention: maybe for a family member who was ill or for some world event that needed a peaceful resolution. We offered everything to God: joys and sorrows, pleasant and unpleasant happenings, whatever the day might bring. This practice had the effect of giving meaning to those monotonous aspects calling for our attention as well as the unexpected surprises which made us smile. You might try just using your own words to transform whatever is "on your plate" to an offering of thanks to the One who gives each of us the gift of life each day.

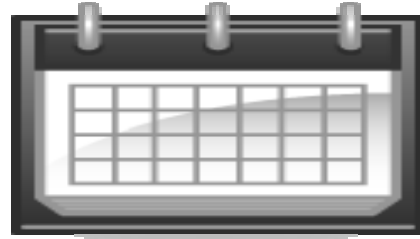

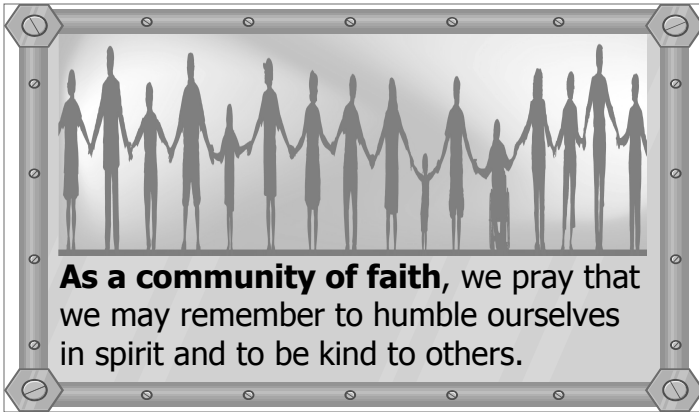
