Things you may want to know this week

1. With Archbishop Cordileone coming this Sunday (March 7) and presiding over the **Pastor's Installation mass at 11:30AM**, I will officially be your pastor. The Installation mass will now be **INSIDE THE CHURCH** contrary to the previous announcement of an Outdoor mass. Inasmuch as we want to accommodate everybody inside the church, we are still restricted to a capacity of 100. If capacity is reached or you prefer to worship outdoors, we will livestream on a big TV screen and serve communion at the back of the church where we usually have our outdoor masses. It is very helpful if you can download and fill out the form on the website and bring it with you when you come to mass. There will be **NO RECEPTION** after the mass. Don't worry, we are still going to serve lunch to the Archbishop and maybe with few of our parish leaders.
2. Sixty (60) students from both our school and CCD Program will receive their **First Reconciliation** on Saturday, March 6, 2021 at 10AM. This is a perfect time to have the sacrament during this Lenten Season and a perfect reminder for all of us to be reconciled to our Lord and to our brothers and sisters.
3. **Fr. Mark Doherty** has been appointed as the new rector of St. Patrick's Seminary and University located in Menlo Park. If you recall, this position was occupied by the late Auxiliary Bishop Robert Christian who suddenly passed away after less than a year of being ordained a bishop and just a few months of being the rector of the seminary.
4. We now have a new facilitator for the **Grief and Consolation Ministry** in our parish. Thank you, **Judy Kerrigan**, for responding to the call to serve God's people who are hurting and grieving. A training will be provided for those who are interested in this ministry. Please call the parish office!
